SHOPLIFTING

Shoplifting is Theft and a Criminal Offence.

Selection 334 of the Criminal Code of Canada,

deals with the offence of theft.

If you are charged and convicted of a theft; For an item valued in excess of \$5,000. The penalty can be up to 10 years in jail. For an item valued at less than \$5,000. The penalty can be up to 2 years in jail.

Section 494 of the Criminal Code of Canada provides that a store owner or authorized agent, can arrest without warrant any person found committing, a Criminal Offence in relation to the store property.

Simply put, if the store owner or agent finds you stealing you can be arrested and turned over to the police for prosecution.

It doesn't matter if the item is worth \$1.00 or \$1,000.00.

Theft is theft

Many people are not aware of the serious consequences of a theft and the impact it can have, on the victims and their own lives.

When items are stolen, the tore owner must pass along the increased costs to all the honest, paying customers.

There are costs to all involved in installing and maintaining theft deterrent technologies, like video cameras and store security personnel. There are costs involved for policing and prosecution of the offender.

Theft costs consumers millions of dollars on an annual basis.
