'No justice' say teen's parents

for Raymond," Brian Getty said, noting that the judge and the teen's lawyer said he was remorseful.

"But, he hasn't been remorseful to us. He's never apologized - he's never said that he's sorry to our family," Getty said, adding lax youth and gun laws need to be changed.

In his judgment, Justice LeDressay called Getty's death "every parent's worst nightmare" and said the tragic facts in the "not intentional killing' were not in dispute.

The court heard the teen, on a Christmas pass from a Brampton group home, took a 270c. Winchester hunting rifle from the bedroom closet of belief, according to Justice

a boarder at his mother's house, pointed it at an 11-yearold Acton boy, and then at Ray Getty.

The teen tapped the trigger lock and the rifle discharged, killing Getty almost instantly. The teen was charged with second degree murder, but it was withdrawn, and replaced with criminal negligence causing death, when forensic testing found the rifle was capable of being fired with the trigger locks in place.

The teen's lawyer, Charles Waite of Brampton, argued his client had an honest and reasonable belief that the rifle was not capable of being fired because of the trigger locks.

That was not a reasonable

LeDressay who said the defendant's behaviour - loading and pointing the rifle and "tapping" the trigger locks -"represents a marked depar-

ture from the behaviour of a reasonably prudent person, and showed a wanton or reckless disregard for the life or safety of others, in this case, Ray Getty."

The YO, described as a "model prisoner" declined to make any comment when offered the opportunity before being sentenced to time served, and three months of community supervision, a joint sentence submission from the crown and defence.

He was placed on three years probation and prohibited from possessing weapons or ammunition for three years, and he must stay out of Acton.

Three days after the verdict and sentencing, Ray Getty's re-married mother, Bonnie Bennett of Acton, said the sentence still felt like a "kick in the face."

"That's not justice - he's free and my son is dead. That sentence is not even a slap on the wrist," Bennett said on Sunday.

"We feel robbed - justice was not served," she said, adding it was hard to hear the teen who killed her son called a model prisoner who completed some school courses and counselling while in custody.

"My son was a great boy, too, but he's no longer here," Bennett said, adding she was very surprised the teen did not say anything in court to Ray's grieving family.

"I was told he wants to get together with me and talk, but to me, in my own heart, if he wanted to talk to me, he had the perfect chance that day (in court)," Bennett said, adding if she did meet her son's killer her instinct would be to "slap him across the face and ask him why."


