# Dead crows test WNv positive - one found south of Acton

Two dead crows were reported to the Halton Region Health Department recently that have both tested positive for West Nile virus (WNv), bringing Halton's total to five.

One crow was found near the intersection of Fairview Street and the QEW in Burlington. The other was found in rural Milton, south of Acton.

Maps showing the locations of positive birds, as well as standing water sites and catch basins larvicided are available on the Health Department's website at www.region.halton.on.ca/ health.

"Through the Health Department's surveillance program, we're beginning to see more West Nile virus activity in Halton," said Dr. Bob Nosal, Medical Officer of Health for the Halton Region Health Department.

Although there have been no human cases of WNv in Ontario yet this season, the Health Department is advising residents to protect themselves from mosquito bites. The following are steps that residents can take.

· Avoid areas with high mosquito populations.

·Wear light-coloured clothing, including long sleeves, pants and a hat, to cover exposed skin when outdoors in the evening or early morning.

• Use a mosquito repellent approved by Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency.

·Make sure all windows and doors in your home have screens that are in good condition.

·Take extra precaution from dusk to dawn when mosquito activity is particularly high.
