41 Aqua Ducks receive honours at Awards Night

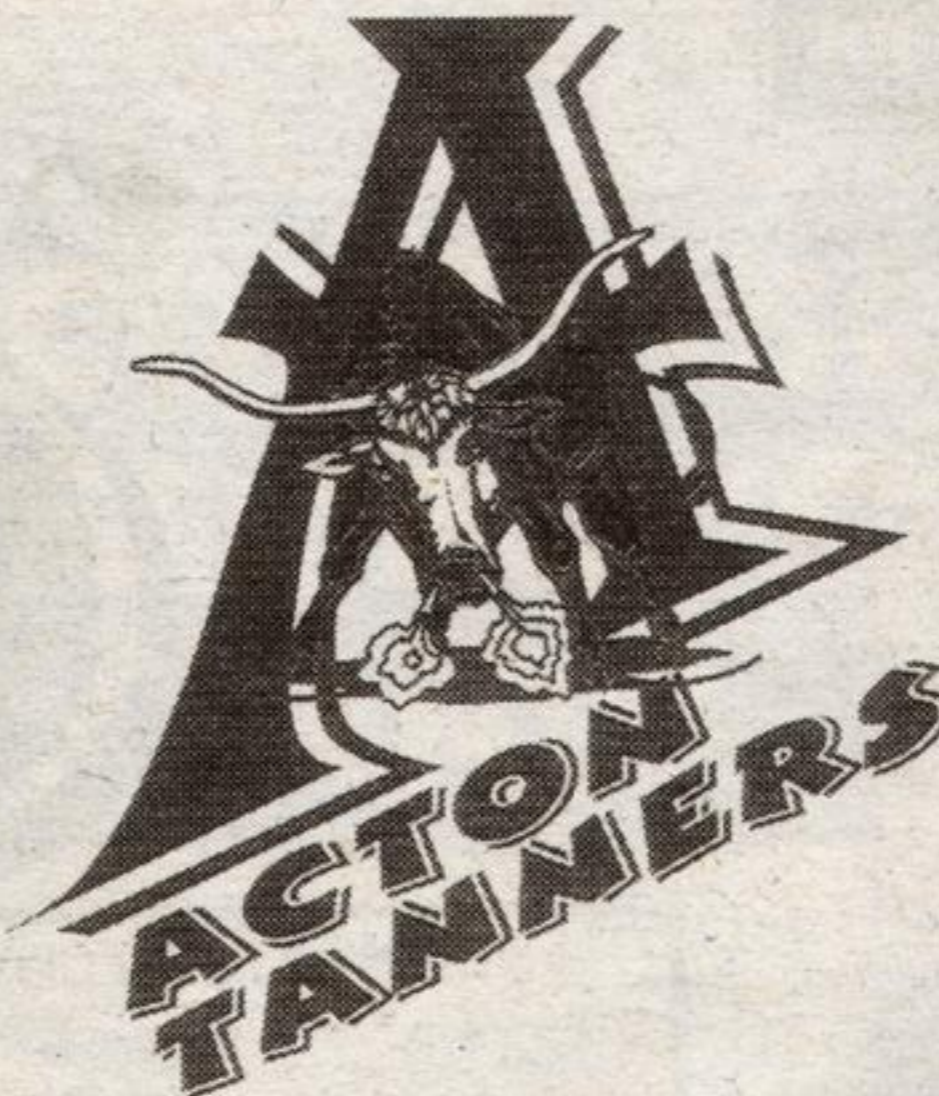

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Team selections will be made after the tryouts by Sept. 30, 2004. If selected, you will be required to provide a final cheque for the following amount upon signature of the OMHA player's card: players born Jan 1, 1994 or later ~ \$600, players born on or before Dec 31, 1993 ~ \$650. If a player is not selected, the \$300 deposit will be returned by Sept. 21, 2004.
- Registration includes regular season gate fees, one pair of home socks and one pair of away socks for each player.
- Cheques, money orders or credit card info for registration fees must be provided as specified above: **cash payments will not be accepted.**
- In order to be considered registered, all the information requested on the registration form must be provided in full; medical comments, such as allergies, etc, could be useful to the training staff in an emergency situation.
- Players who wish to try out for AMHA Rep Hockey teams must be registered before they can be allowed onto the ice for tryouts. Players who are not registered either due to incomplete information or non payment of fees will not be allowed on the ice until such time as they have completed the registration process.

*The amounts of the final instalments have changed due to the fact that the Tri-County League voted to remove the collection of Playoff Gate Fees. In order to recuperate this revenue, the AMHA was obliged to add \$50 to each of the final instalment amounts estimated in the spring. The higher AMHA 2004-2005 Registration Fees are due, in part, to the significantly lower than budgeted revenues from Fund Raising events for the past two years. This year, Registration Fees will cover the majority of operational expenses. Please see the newsletter for information on how you can get involved with Fund Raising in order to help stabilize or even lower Registration Fees.
