

Public forum at Region to hear Ontario growth plan

Halton Region is hosting a public forum on September 9 for residents and businesses to learn about the recently released Provincial Growth Management Strategy.

The forum will be held in the auditorium of the Halton Regional Centre, in the north side of the building located at 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville. A drop-in open house begins at 6 p.m., with presentations starting at 7p.m.

In July, the Ministry of Public Infrastructure and Renewal released a paper entitled "Places to Grow: A Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe" that addresses the Province's vision for how and where municipalities will grow. The paper also addresses the infrastructure and environmental impacts of this growth.

Halton's Forum is the public's opportunity to learn about the Provincial Strategy. At this time, confirmation from the Prov-

WEEKEND HIKE? Try the Limehouse Conservation Area, one of the most interesting wild spaces in the area. The Bruce Trail goes through the area as well as the Black Creek which tumbles down the Escarpment in this photo past the ruins of the Limehouse Lime Works with its kilns and power magazine, now fenced off along the trail. Chemical reaction between limestone and rainwater created many caves and tunnels in the area. It is reputed they made great hiding places for rustlers, thieves, smugglers and bootleggers. Stories still abound about whisky stills and even murder in the Limehouse caves. The Conservation Area is part of the Credit Valley Authority's jurisdiction.
