## Mayor's Corner





Council is deep in budget discussions. We have had many meetings on this year's budget. This will be the first year the Pavement Management Plan will be implemented. What is the Pavement Management Plan? This was supported last year at budget and something that I campaigned on. This is where we increase your taxes by 2%. This 2% goes directly to resurfacing roads. Nothing else. The Town is \$57 million behind in repairing roads. You may ask "how in the world did this happen?" I will give you a quick history lesson on the Town of Halton Hills. Acton, Esquesing, and Georgetown were amalgamated in 1974 to become the Town of Halton Hills.

The Province wanted to see this marriage work so they gave one dollar for every dollar the Town spent on roads. When I was first elected in 1982, the Province was already reviewing its contribution for every dollar the Town would spend on roads.

By the early 90's, the Provincial Government of the day cancelled their contribution for roads, leaving the

a senior. The cost is \$10 per person.




Tickets for the Valentine Dinner are all sold. It looks like it will be its usual great success!
