AHS athletes chalk up medals

Twelve track and field athletes from Acton High School competed at the 15th annual Cardinal Carter Track and Field Classic last Friday and Saturday in great weather. One hundred and twelve schools were represented by 1900 athletes.

Acton came home with two golds, one fourth and one sixth place finish with a total of 25 points. Many personal best performances were recorded.

Kaitlyn Andrews placed first in the Senior Girls' Discus with a toss of 39.56 metres. This was a new meet record, school record and a personal best. In

the Shot Put she also placed first with a put of 13.06 metres. This was a new meet record, school record and a personal best in outdoor competition this year.

Kaitlyn was chosen as the Outstanding Senior Female Athlete of the meet and received a pair of Brooks Shoes.

Dan Kearns placed 4th in the Junior Boys Shot Put with a score of 12.41 metres. This was a personal best in competition. Dan also placed 9th in the Discus with a personal best throw of 35.07 metres.

Jaimi Fellows placed 6th in the Junior Girls High Jump with a score of 1.40 metres.

Matt Bigg had two personal best performances. He ran 2 minutes 18 seconds in the Midget Boys' 800 metres and 4 minutes 50.88 seconds in the 1500 metres.

Dave Carscadden ran 13.75 seconds in the Midget Boys' 100 metres. He ran 27.84

seconds in the 200 metres and 63.38 seconds in the 400 metres.

Jesse Check ran 13.23 seconds in the Midget Boys' 100 metres and jumped 4.98 metres and earned a 9th place finish in the Midget Boys' Long Jump.

Troy Ethier ran the Senior Boys 100 metres in 11.61 seconds and triple jumped 11.50 metres.

Caitlyn Mackie-Richards jumped 1.30 metres in the Midget Girls' High Jump.

Ashton Rosa ran 4 minutes and 54.5 seconds in the Senior Boys 1500 metres.

Tracey Singles ran 15.13 in the Midget Girls 100 metres and jumped 3.17 metres in the Midget Girls Long Jump.

Robyn Spiers ran 15.64 in the Midget Girls 100 metres.

Ryan Wagg ran 65.74 in the Midget Boys 400 metres. The next meet is the GHAC qualifiers at Nelson Stadium.

**Only small tree stumps under 30 cm (1 ft) in diameter can be accepted at the HWMS.
