

Kyle Dodd makes squad

Eastern Michigan University (EMU) released its 2005-2006 basketball roster on Friday, July 22 and it includes Kyle Dodd of Rockwood.

The 6'10" centre, a graduate of John F. Ross Collegiate in Guelph, will play in the NCAA Division 1 men's basketball for EMU. He's the only Canadian listed on the team roster where most players are from Michigan.

Kyle is also one of the tallest players on the team at 6'10" sharing that height with centre Chris Knaub.


