




Playground Improvement Committee busy

According to Deb Drake, the Rockwood Centennial Playground Improvement Committee has been busy over the summer. Donation boxes have been placed in many local businesses. Look for them and give generously, even if it is small change. Organizers have also been working on their "Shop Rockwood" campaign. Businesses can purchase advertisement in flyers, which students and volunteers will distribute to friends and family, encouraging people to "support businesses who support our children." They have also been approaching businesses regarding grants, which has been labour intensive and has not yet yielded positive results. Last June, there was a coin drive at the school which raised \$900. The student council raised a further \$500. The current total raised is over \$21,000 almost half way to reaching their goal of \$50,000. The first business to have their name on the playground plaque is Cantario Marketing Inc. for donating \$2,500. Other supporters were Wellington Trailer Sales, Golden Woods Riding, Rockwood True Value Hardware, Swanston Farm Equipment, and Rockwood Pharmacy.


As a first improvement to the playground, there will be games painted on the asphalt this fall as soon as it is repaired. The installation of portable classrooms has torn up some asphalt and delayed the game painting. When the \$50,000 goal is reached, play structures will be installed to replace the ones that the government removed.




