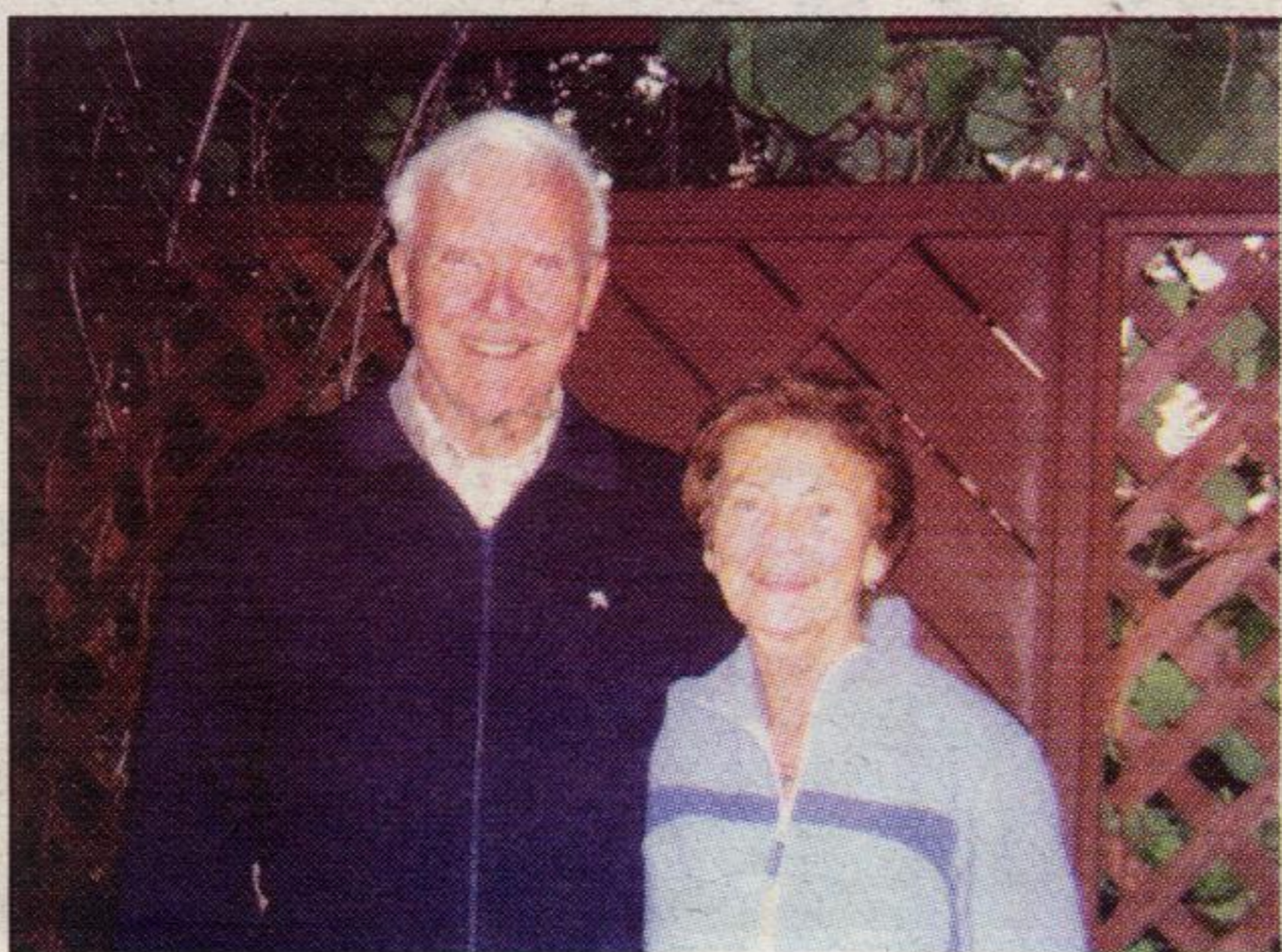


Acton couple celebrates 50 years

Halton adopts bylaw to prevent clear cuts

Halton Regional Council has adopted a new Tree By-law, to prohibit or regulate the destruction or injuring of trees in Halton Region after nearly two years of consultation.

The Tree By-law, applies to trees located in greenlands or woodlands larger than 0.5 hectares and is primarily designed to prevent unauthorized clear cutting in Halton Region.

“Halton’s new Tree By-law is an excellent example of our

commitment to engaging the community and incorporating their suggestions into Regional policies that serve a broad audience,” said Halton Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline. “Through two years of open houses, committee and Council meetings and working closely with both the Halton Agricultural Advisory Committee and Halton’s Ecological and Environmental Advisory Committee, we have been successful in developing a by-law that will work throughout the Region.”

In addition to adopting the Tree By-Law, Regional Council also asked Regional staff to include a Woodlands Stewardship Program to effectively introduce the new by-law on January 1, 2006. The program will include an information package explaining the Region’s objective on forestry resource, land-owners’ rights, tax incentive programs and sources for more information.

Halton Hills Urban Yard Waste Collection Tips

Urban Yard Waste is collected every other week on the same day as your Blue Box from April 6 to December 7, 2005.

Acceptable Items include:
Yard and garden trimmings, leaves, pumpkins, fallen fruit and tree and brush trimmings

Unacceptable Items include:
Grass clippings, tree stumps, sod, soil and rocks
Garbage and recyclable material

Tips for setting out your yard waste:

- Use open, reusable, rigid containers such as bushel basket or plastic tub
- Place a yard waste sticker on your container (available from Halton Region)
- Use a paper yard waste bag
- Bags, containers must be less than 23 kg (50 lbs)

Brush:
Must be tied in bundles no larger than 1.2 m (4 ft) long by 0.6 m (2 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm (3 ") in diameter.

Note: Yard waste placed out in plastic bags (including decorative Halloween bags) and cardboard boxes will not be completed.
