

# Blaze destroys Limehouse home

An oil-fired hot water heater in the garage is the suspected cause of a blaze which tore through a house at 11029 Fifth Line in Limehouse Wednesday night.

The fire started at about 8:30 p.m. at the house owned by Ron and Becky Moore.

Halton Hills Fire Department

reports that Ron was the only one home at the time of the blaze. He heard a bang, opened the door to the garage to see what caused it, and was knocked down by heavy black smoke.

He escaped uninjured.

Damage to the house is estimated at \$250,000, and damage to

an adjacent large storage shed is set at \$5,000. Firefighters were at the scene for about six hours.

Harold Postma, branch manager of the Halton Community Credit Union, in Acton said a fire trust account has been set up at the branch for the Moores. Donations will be used to replace

children's toys and clothing.

"We already have one donation from staff at the bank," said Postma. "They have banked here for a long time."

Donations to the trust account can be made at the Acton, Milton, Georgetown, Burlington or Oakville branches.
