Midget Raiders ousted early from local tourney

The Georgetown Sunny Acre Farms "AA" Midget Raiders were eliminated early from the 27th annual Georgetown Midget Tournament, which wraps up tonight (Sunday) with championship games at 6 and 8 p.m.

The local Raiders took a 5-2 loss to Aurora in their second round-robin game which put them out of semi-final contention.

Unlike the team's first loss to Thornhill, Georgetown wasn't able to grab an early lead and were outplayed and outhustled through all three periods.

Georgetown's Marc Boucher and David Boere scored goals for their squad while Boere picked up an assist on Boucher's goal. Chad Hughes started in net and was replaced after Aurora's fifth goal late in the third peri-

Meanwhile, the Acton Sabres won their second game 4-2 against Burlington but were ousted with a 9-1 loss to East Enders.

Scoring for Acton in the 4-2 win were Michael Forbes with a pair and Wilf Couling and Josh Davies with singles.

The local Halton "AAA" Hurricanes beat Guelph 4-1 in their opening game and played two games yesterday (Saturday).

Also eliminated early from competition were Newmarket, Burlington, Thornhill, Hillcrest, Streetsville and Guelph.

Milton, Aurora and Chinguacousy each had two wins and led their divisions after Thursday night action.

Semi-final match-ups will be held this afternoon (sunday) while the "AAA" championship finals will take place at 6 p.m. and the "AA" finals are slated for an 8 p.m. start at the Gordon Alcott Arena in Georgetown.

The Raiders and Burlington were evenly matched during the first period which ended in a 1-1 tie. Steven Kogon scored for Georgetown assisted by linemates Ryan Hirtle and Joel Hamilton. Georgetown couldn't get going in the second and third periods, allowing Burlington to dominate the game and finish victorious. Defenceman Eric Euteneier played strong to claim the MVP honour for this game.

On Wednesday December 29th the Raiders played their best game of the Tournament securing a 4-3 win over the

Oshawa Bruins.

This was an exciting game as the Raiders took a 2-0 lead in the first period. Kogon put Georgetown on the scoreboard after taking a pass from teammate Norton. Norton then put the Raiders ahead by two on a nice pass by Kogon. MacDonald put the Raiders up 3-0 early in the second period.

Oshawa then replied with three goals to tie the game before Hamilton dumping one in for Georgetown with one minute left.
