

New victim fine surcharge in effect

As of January 1, a new victim fine surcharge will be in effect in Ontario. Revenue from the surcharge will be used to support victims' services. The surcharge will be applied to all offences prosecuted under the Provincial Offences Act, except for parking. For example, if you are convicted of a traffic or liquor offence, you will have to pay a surcharge on your fine. For fines of less than \$50, the surcharge will be \$5. For fines of \$1,000 or more, the surcharge will be 20 per cent.

It will cost more to hike in 1995 at Credit Valley conservation areas

Visitors to Credit Valley Conservation areas next year will pay more for many of the user fees than they have in the past.

Beginning next month the Credit Valley Conservation Authority is increasing several of its fees, something it hasn't done since 1992.

Day use fees for seniors, adults and children will increase by 25 cents per person per day. The maximum daily fee for a vehicle will jump from \$10 to \$12, and the bus fee will increase from \$60 to \$70.

Annual fees will also increase. An annual personal pass will

increase from \$21.50 to \$24 and an annual vehicle pass from \$55.75 to \$81.

Most of the camping fees will also rise. The event camping rate will increase to \$18 from \$15, the group camping rate will rise from \$2.50 to \$2.75 and the cost of firewood will increase from \$5.50 to \$6.

Reservation fees will remain the same as in 1994 and there will be no increase in the area's interpretive program.

Increases will apply to the Orangeville Waterfowl Hunt. The rate per person using lead shot will rise from \$10 to \$12, from \$8 to \$10 when using steel or bismuth shot, and the rate per person to hunt both Saturday morning and evening hunts will increase from \$15 to \$18.

There will be no increases to the picnic options, but the winter program equipment rental rates will rise in 1995.

The complete ski package daily rate will increase from \$7.50 to \$15 and the group rate will be \$11.25. Skis only will increase \$4 to \$8 and the group rate will be \$6. Boots will rent for \$6 and \$4.50 (group), and poles for \$4 and \$3 (group).

The Orangeville Pike Derby rates will also increase in 1995. Adults who pre-register will face a \$5 increase to \$25, children \$2 increase to \$12 and families \$20 jump to \$70.

All ski merchandise and services, such as waxing, will increase by 25 cents. There will also be a 50 cent increase in the admission cost for students and seniors for the Terra Cotta Public Maple Syrup program.
