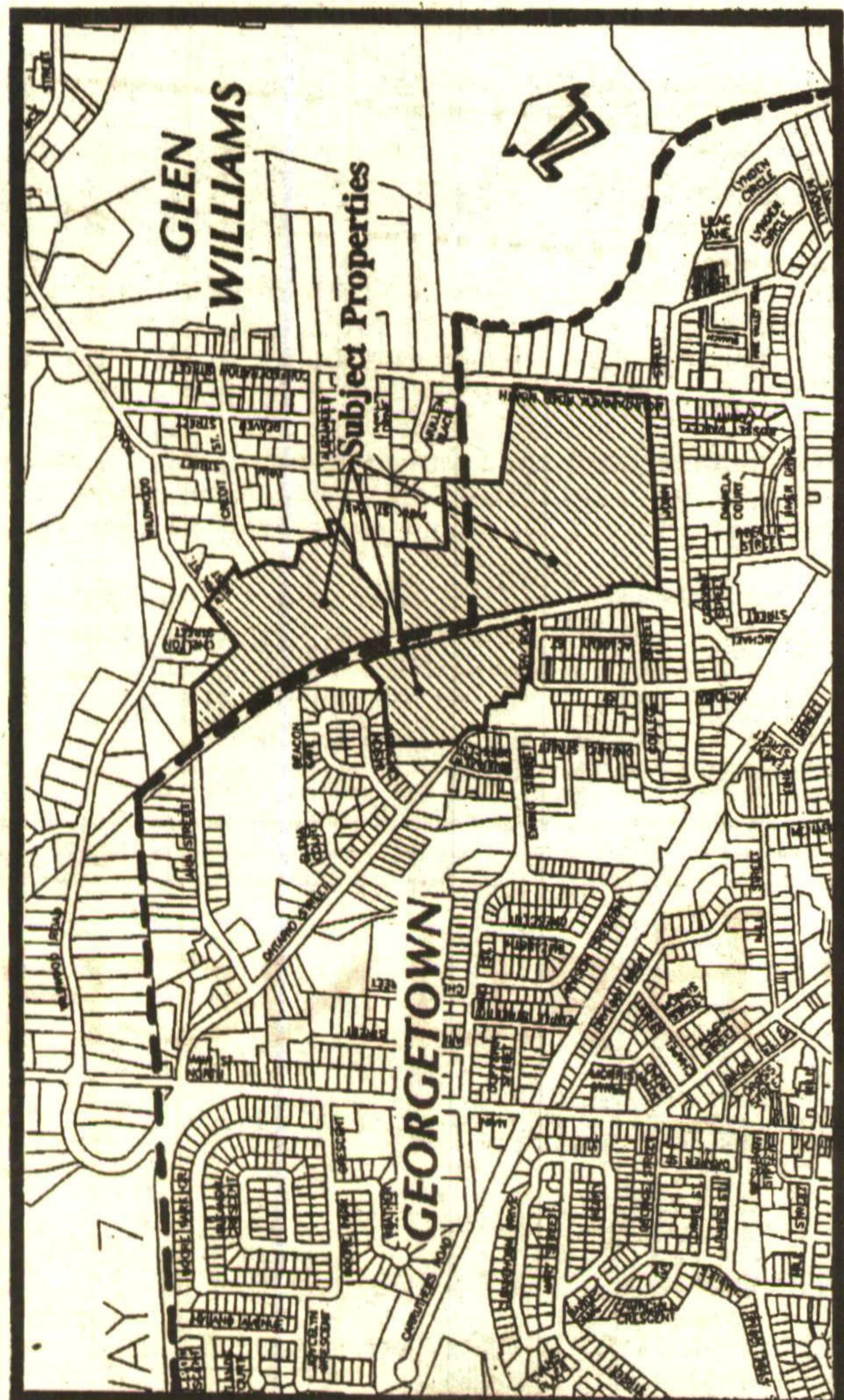

Police seek assistance in Acton store robbery

The combined efforts of Halton officers and Peel's canine unit failed to locate a suspect for an Acton variety store robbery on New Year's Eve, and assistance from the public is being sought to identify the person responsible.

Just prior to 10 p.m. on Saturday, December 31st, a man entered the Lakeview Convenience Store at 126 Main Street North. He threatened the store clerk with a knife while demanding money. The till was opened by the staffer who then ran from the building.

The thug grabbed some of the money and ran from the store, where he again threatened the complainant, before running behind the building and out of sight.

The suspect was described to police as male, white, 5'8" tall with

a slim build. He was dressed completely in dark clothing, including a ski mask.

If you think you may know who committed this robbery, you could earn some money by providing Crime Stoppers with the man's name.

If you have any information that leads to an arrest in this or any other case, you may be eligible for a cash reward of up to \$1,000. You need not give your name and your information will be treated with anonymity. Crime Stoppers does not subscribe to call display.
