

To be eligible for senior kindergarten, children must be five years of age by December 31, 1995. To be eligible for junior kindergarten, children must be four years of age by December 31, 1995. Children must RESIDE within the boundaries of the school offering the program and must be a public school supporter.

Registrations are held at the public elementary school your child will attend. To make registration easy, please bring verification of your child's date of birth and your child's immunization record.

There may be a few spaces available for junior kindergarten on a lottery basis for children living outside the school area. Details about the lottery process, which will be held in late spring, are available through the Education Centre in your area.


