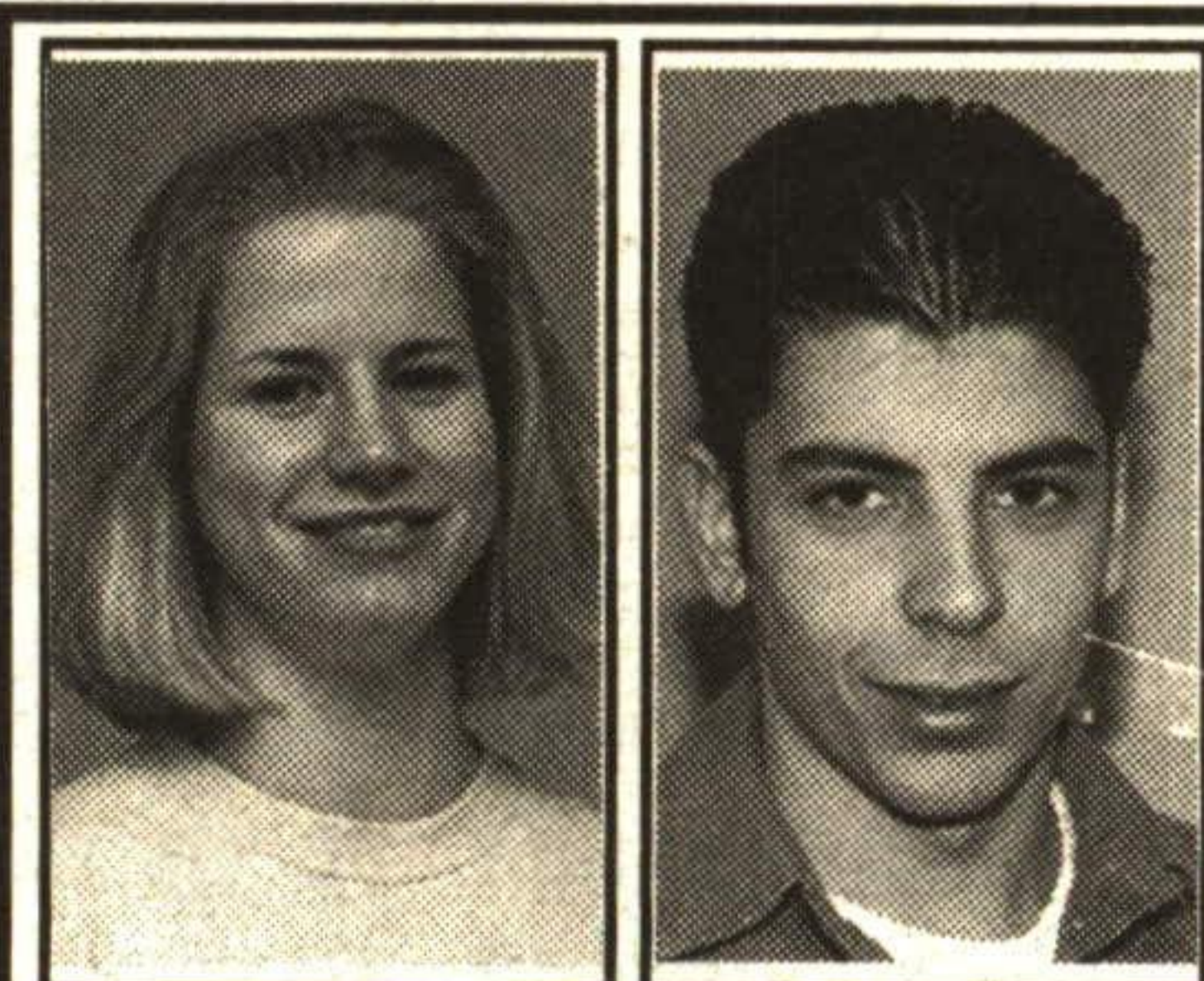

All boys and girls, ages 10 to 14 as of January 1st, 1995, are welcome.

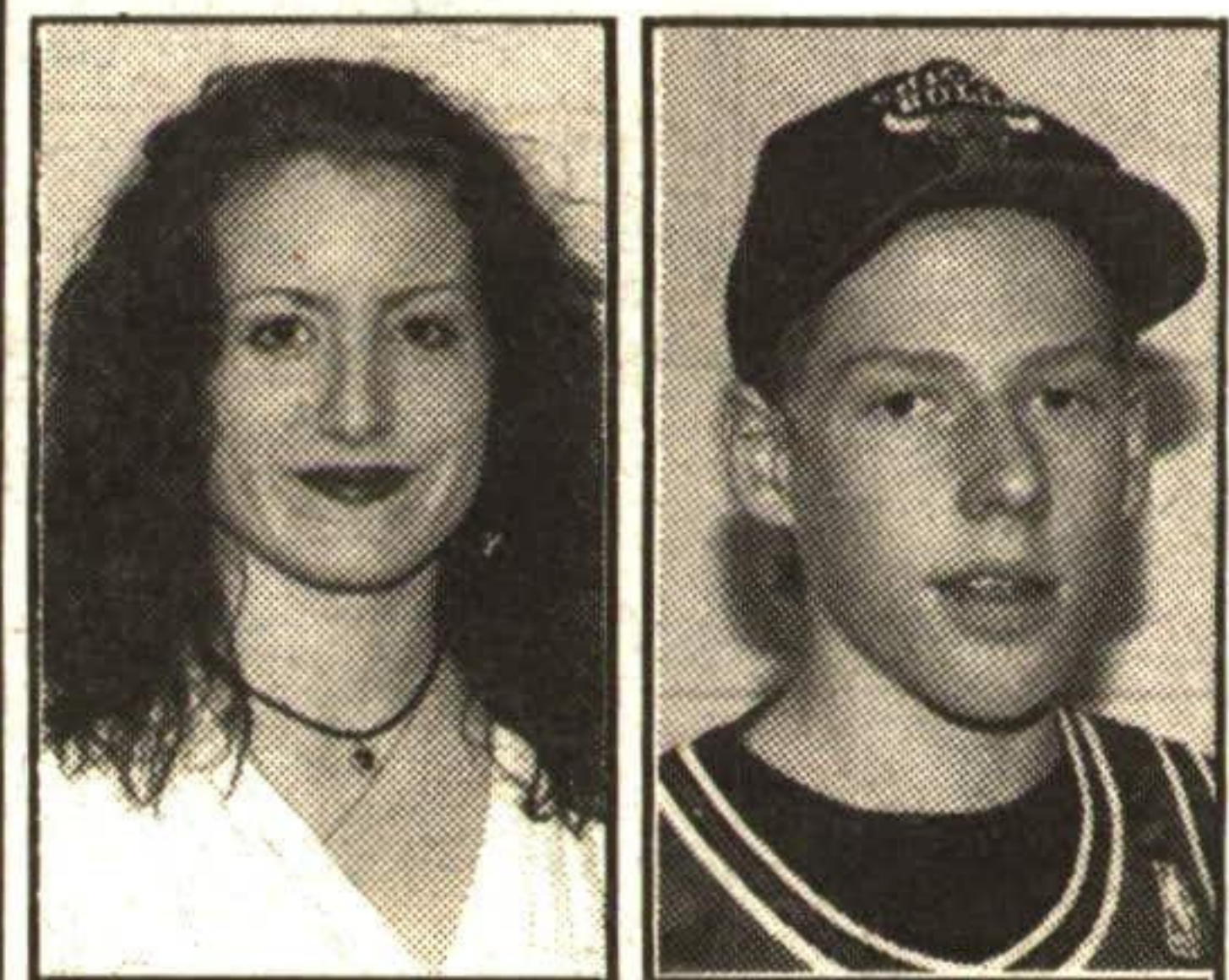
