On the senior circuit, Francis Beans scored a 10-5 win over Aqua Stingers and tied Big Bad Smurfs 4-


Colleen Thompson was the highscorer for Beans with five goals while Jennifer Elliot fired in three for the Stingers. Angie Van Egmond




