



To reach that target, the board will be "cutting supplies kids need, cutting teachers kids need and buildings kids go to school in," said a defiant Halton Hills trustee, Dave Whiting.

"How the hell are you going to keep the rate at 0 per cent without something giving and more often than not,

it's in the area of maintenance," he said.

Budget cuts concern Whiting

The comments came in the wake of a proposal at Thursday night's regular meeting to incorporate a fiveyear renovation plan into the 1995 budget. The past two budgets have not included non-growth projects because of financial restrictions.

The list of priority schools in the Capital Expenditure Forecast (CEF), led by M.M. Robinson in Burlington, includes Gladys Speers Public School (\$3 million) and White Oaks Secondary School (WOSS) (\$5.3 million) in Oakville which are schedule for major renovations in 1997 and 1998, respectively.

Two delegations, one by Janice Caster representing the River Oaks Association of Residents (ROAR) and the other, a slide show presentation by WOSS students, magnified the urgent need for maintenance at the high

school. Caster said the projected growth in the River Oaks area had accelerated at a quicker pace than anticipated. With the Ministry capacity for WOSS set at 1,485 students, Caster told trustees, "We are going to be

once again into an over-populated school. "We're setting ourselves up for serious problems," said Caster, adding that WOSS was in need of

renovations now and in '98 "at the latest." By approving the incorporation of the plan into the budget process, the board was not committing to specific figures, but to starting the process, clarified Lynda Schreiber, chair of the property committee.

Public input invited

On February 27 and March 2, the Finance Committee of the Halton Board of Education will be discussing budget priorities for the 1995 budget year.

Individuals and groups are invited to share their concerns by sending written comments, addressing the committee in a presentation or participating in a question-answer period at then end of the formal meeting. In addition to these public input meetings, members of the community are also welcome to participate in the other meetings of finance on February 20 and March 6, 27, and 30.
