





## Regimental Military Band of the Lorne Scots returns to Georgetown

The Regimental Military Band of the Lorne Scots has returned to Georgetown after an absence of some 37 years.

The two predecessor regiments both formed bands in 1866. The band of the 36th Peel Battalion of Infantry alternated between Brampton and Orangeville; the band of the 20th Halton Battalion of Infantry was formed in Oakville.

In 1936 the two regiments, by now renamed the Peel and Dufferin Regiment and the Lorne Rifles (Scottish), amalgamated to form the Lorne Scots (Peel, Dufferin and Halton Regiment). At the time the Georgetown Citizens' Band became the Regimental Band and in later years, under Bandmaster Alf Parrot, won the Robert Simpson trophy for winning the CNE band contest three years in a row.

In 1958 the band was reorganized in Milton by Captain E.G. Corlett,

then relocated to Oakville in 1962. The band came under the direction of Captain (later Major) M.A. Rehill in 1977.

The band has now relocated to the new Colonel J.R. Barber Armory in Georgetown. The Lorne Scots Regimental Pipes and Drums have also been restationed here from Brampton.


In recent years the band has performed at the Tower of London; Dallas, Texas, Buckhannon, West Virginia and numerous locations throughout Ontario from Camp Pettawawa to Port Colborne. Some performances are made with the Regimental Pipes and Drums and with other regimental and civilian bands of the district. Part of the band operates as the Regimental Dance Band, performing on a professional level at various functions.

With the recent reorganizations of the militia, serving members of the band were transferred from the regiment but it is gratifying that all have continued with the Lorne Scots Band as volunteer members. Current membership is drawn from a wide area, from Alton to Stoney Creek and from Brampton to Cambridge with local members from Milton, Georgetown, Acton and Ballinafad.
