GREEN THUMB GARDENING

By CHRISTINE COLE START SOWING NOW

It is time once again to start planning and planting seeds for this season's flower garden. Many annual flowers from seeds will bloom in 10-12 weeks from their sowing date. Ageratum, Allysum, Dianthus, Dusty Miller, Foxglove, Geranium, Impatiens, Pansy and many others should be started in March. But, fast growers such as Cosmos, Marigold and Zinnia can be started in April. Starting any of these seeds too early in the season results in thin, sparse plants that rarely transplant well into the outdoor

ered with a thin layer of soil or sand. The seeds should not be covered any deeper than twice the diameter of the seeds. However, Begonia, Pansy and other very small seeds do not require this layer. Once the seeds have germinated, they should be placed in high light to grow. Keep the soil uniformly moist, at all times. Water that is room temperature should be applied during the day,

mid-May.

garden bed. A well-drained potting soil or a specially prepared germinating mix is essential for germinating seeds. The seeds can be cov-

so that the foliage will dry before night. This will reduce the danger of diseases establishing in the soil or on the plant. Before planting the seedlings in the garden, they should be allowed to adjust to outdoor conditions. Do this by setting them outside or mild days, and bringing them in at night. Once all danger of frost is past, they can be planted in the garden usually
