




Athletes of the Week


A five-goal performance by Meighan McIntyre saw the Lightning Bolts down the Blue Bears 7-1.

Smurfs edged out the Aqua Stingers 6-4.


The Blue Hurricanes won a 9-8 shootout over Green Grass in boys action, and then went on to down the Wild Rebels 1-
