

GREEN THUMB GARDENING

CONTROLLING BLACK KNOT ON FRUIT TREES

One of the most important benefits of pruning is to improve the health of the tree. Pruning out dead and diseased branches will control the spread of diseases to healthy parts of the tree. This type of pruning is particularly important with stone-bearing fruit trees such as cherries, plums and peaches. These are frequently infected with a fungal disease known as "Black Knot". It initially develops on young twigs and can be identified by the hard, crispy, black growths. They are usually thicker than the twig and can reach up to one foot long or more.


In the spring a layer of spores form on the "knots". The spores are then released to infect other branches and other susceptible fruit trees. To prevent further spread of this disease the knots should be pruned from the trees in late winter (before the spores develop and disperse). Since this is a fungal disease it can be spread with the pruning equipment itself. To prevent this, sterilize all pruning equipment with rubbing alcohol or diluted bleach. Cut off all black knots at lease six inches below the visible infection.

Annual pruning will control the spread of the disease and result in healthier, more productive fruit trees.

Human beings have established a track record of laying waste to nature, partially out of greed, partially out of ignorance.


