Novice Raiders reach tournament final

Novice BB

In a close match, the Georgetown Novice BB Raiders edged the much-improved Erin/Hillsburgh team 3-2 in Tri County playoff action last week.

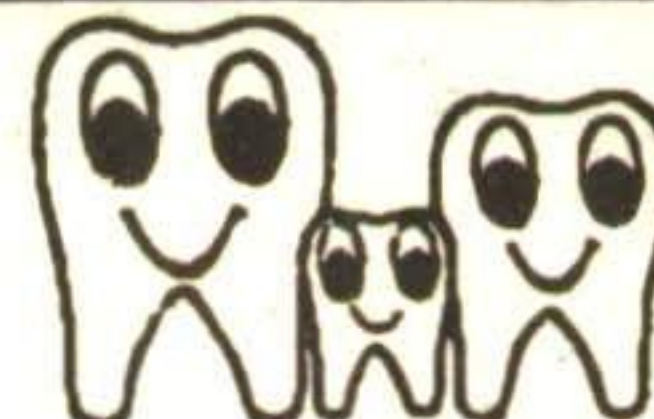
