

Duignan released from hospital

Noel Duignan, Halton North MPP, was released from Toronto General Hospital Wednesday with a clean bill of health.

Duignan underwent two days of tests after he collapsed on Sunday towards the end of a two-day meeting of Ontario NDP provincial council at University of Toronto.

He resumed duties Thursday as Parliamentary Assistant in the Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations.

Premier Bob Rae and House Speaker David Warner were among Duignan's visitors in hospital, as was the Hon. Bob Huget, Minister without Portfolio (Finance) who will be guest speaker at the Halton North NDP nomination

meeting at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, April 6, in the CAW Hall in Milton.

Duignan said of his hospital experience, "The care I got at Toronto General confirms that Ontario's health care system is in good shape, staffed by caring, concerned and competent professionals. I'm reassured that our government is going to keep it that way."

No decision

The provincial government's long-term care legislation became law on Saturday, April 1.

This puts in place a new approach to providing home and health services so that seniors and those with disabilities will be able to live in their homes as long as possible. The services are to be delivered by new communities agencies with fully-elected local boards of volunteers, called multi-service agencies (MSAs).

There is still no decision on whether or not Halton Hills will have its own MSA, as has been requested by many members in this community, including ASSIC and Georgetown Hospital.
