There are two concerts at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. to allow room for families of the 90-voice choir, as well as the public.


The concert is suitable for all ages and includes music from 37 Disney songs. The choir will be in Disney costume, just to add to the fun.

It was easy for Choir Director Dale Wood to pick a Disney theme. His own kids love to sing Disney songs and he knew that it would appeal to all ages in the choir. The six year olds love Zip-A-Dee-Doo-Dah and the teens in the Georgetown Youth Chorus (a division of the Children's Chorus) love Can You Feel The Love Tonight from The Lion King.

What makes Disney music so special?

The memories and emotions that each song inspires. When children of any age go to see a Disney movie, they experience a wide variety of emotions that are a big part of the adventure. In fact, the most difficult problem in




The Georgetown Children's Chorus gave seniors at the Holy Cross Church Hall a preview of their upcoming show.
