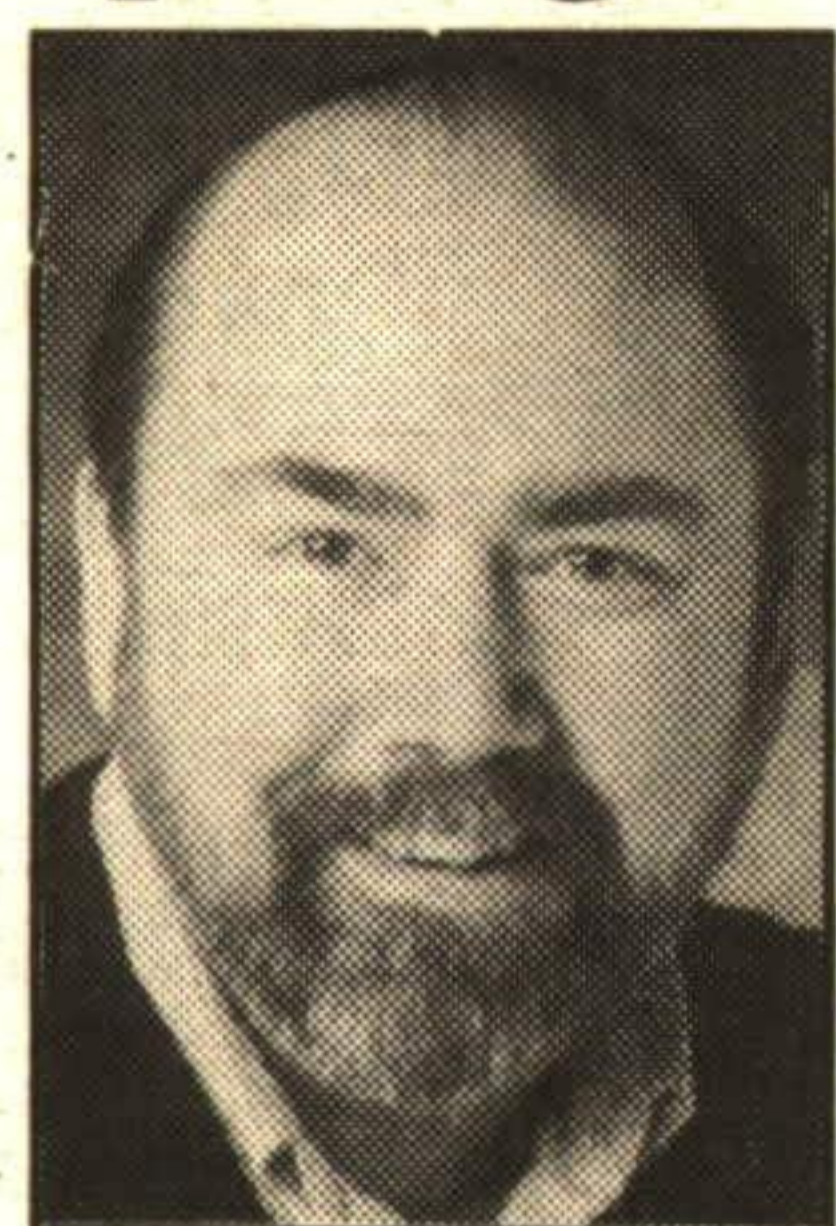


Newcomer plays GLT lead

When Is a 5-Iron Not a 5-Iron?

For many years, all golf clubs, regardless of who made them, were built with standard lofts. That is, the loft of a 5-iron from Wilson was the same as that of a 5-iron from Spalding, Ram, or anyone else. This is no longer true. Different companies build clubs with different lofts. Look at the following examples from well-known clubs:

The King Cobra 7-iron has a loft of 32 degrees. This is the same loft as a 5-iron of a few years ago or the 6-iron of today's Cleveland VAS, Lynx Parallax, and Titleist DCI lines. It is even less than that of the Wilson Staff Progressive 6-iron.

You can see that in almost all cases, club manufacturers are now making irons with LESS loft than in the past. This is because lower lofts produce greater distance and greater distance sells clubs. The trade-off is that lower loft gives you less backspin and slightly less accuracy.

Loft is an easy thing to measure and in most irons it can be altered by up to 2 degrees by bending the hosel (this requires special equipment).

Before purchasing new irons, give some thought to what you need. If more distance is the answer, seek out clubs with lower lofts. However, if more distance will only get you deeper into the woods, look for other characteristics in your sticks.
