

## Local roads to be closed — temporarily

Committee of Halton Hills council passed a recommendation Monday night to pass a bylaw allowing for the temporary stopping of traffic on Sinclair Ave. from Guelph St. to Armstrong Ave. during reconstruction of that stretch of road. Traffic would only be stopped on that road for a short time during the reconstruction set to occur between July 1 and Oct. 15.

A recommendation was also passed that allowed for the temporary stopping of traffic on Cobblehill Rd. in Acton from Main St. to Cook St. due to reconstruction between June 1 and Sept. 30.

Another temporary stopping of traffic bylaw was passed for Third Line from Five Sideroad to 10 Sideroad between July 1 and August 15 due to the reconstruction of the Third Line culvert.

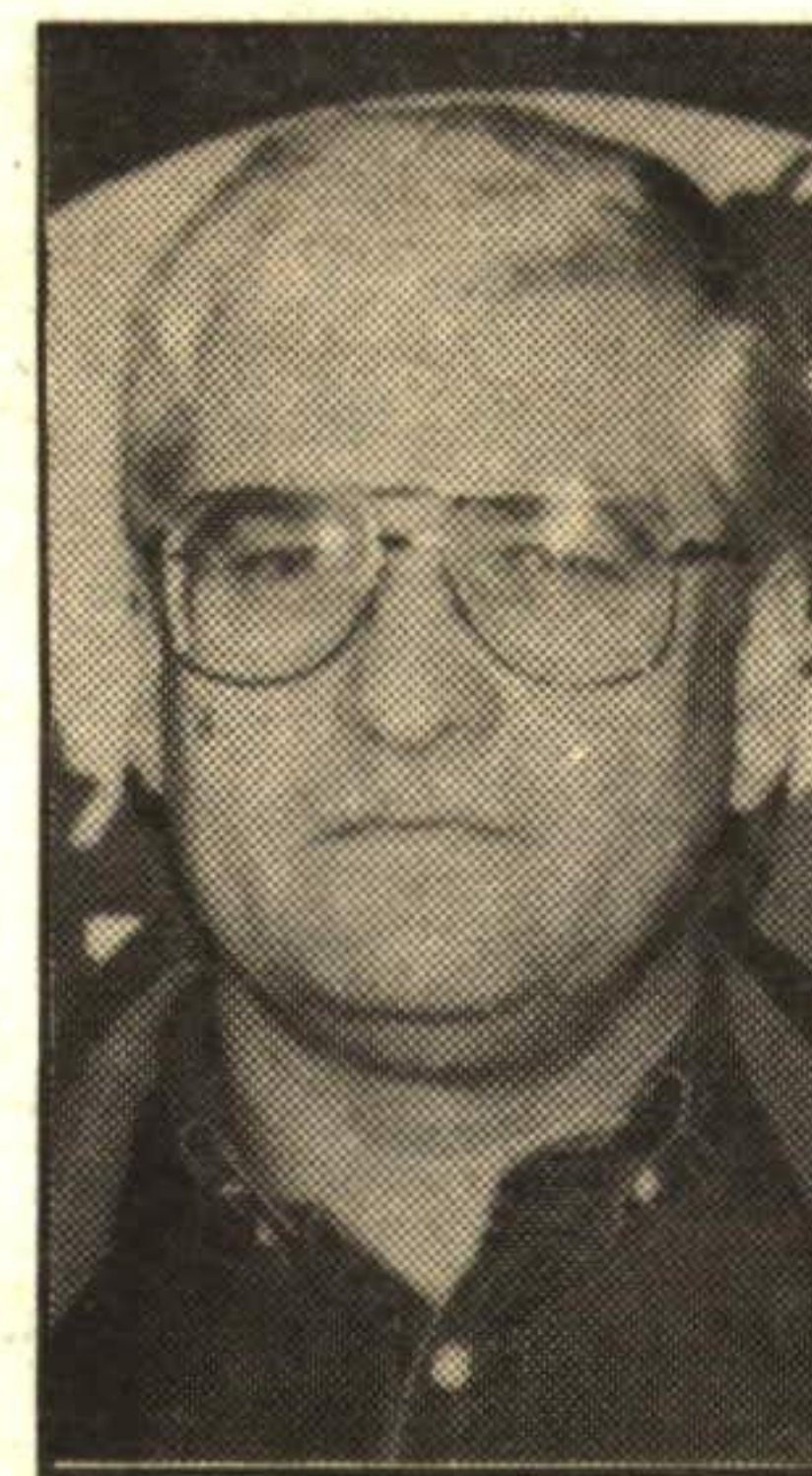
## Westaway wins \$10,000
