Michael Buckingham was a state

trooper with the Washington Highway Patrol when he attempted to pull over an impaired driver one spring night.

The chase that ensued ended in a three-car collision that left him unconscious. Forty-seven per cent of

his body was burned and he spent seven months in hospital and had numerous operations.

Now, Buckingham speaks against impaired driving to groups all across North America. He delivers his message of zero tolerance with honesty and humor, using descriptive examples of how impaired driving has affected other young people.

He addresses how it affects drivers, passengers and pedestrians and the attitude around impaired driving.

Most people feel immune to harm, especially young people. Buckingham emphasizes that not all injuries are physical. Emotional trauma, the flashbacks and nightmares, are destructive and can last a lifetime.

Buckingham will be at Acton High School at 9 a.m. Monday, then at Georgetown High at 1 p.m. He will speak to students at Bishop Reding Tuesday afternoon and will be speaking in Georgetown Tuesday night at 7 p.m.

The presentation at John Elliot Theatre is sponsored by the community consultation committees in the area, as well as Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) and the Injury Prevention Committee.
