Athletes of the Week

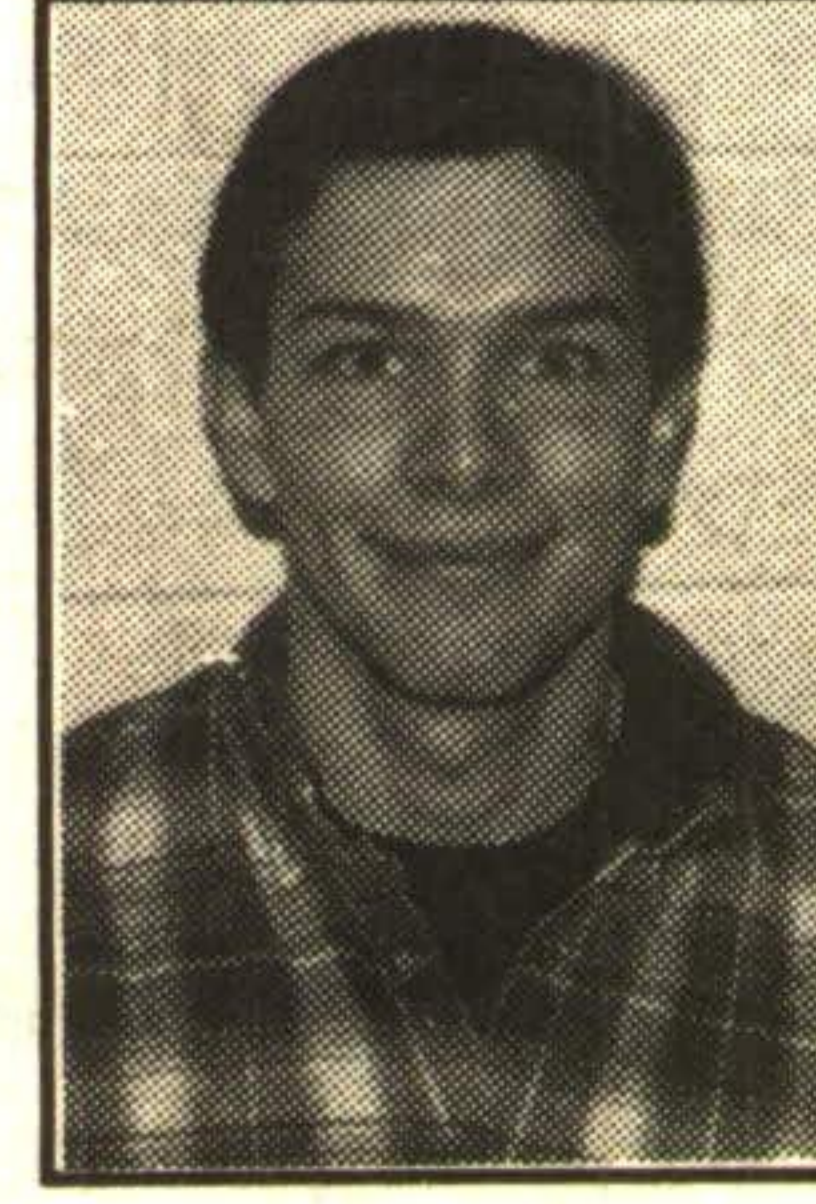
