

Fund started for fire victims

Jacque Egerton, a dispatcher with the Halton Hills Fire Department, doesn't usually get personally involved with fire victims, but something tugged at her heart strings last Saturday night.

Egerton was on duty when the fire call came through at 11:21 p.m. that

a house at 8 Main St. N. in Georgetown was on fire.

Immediately after dispatching the fire-fighters, she called her son, whose friend Ryan Conway lives in the house.

As it turned out, Conway was sitting in her son's living room when the call came through. Egerton was relieved he

was safe.

Conway lost everything in the fire, including his car, with the exception of a grocery bag containing some clothing.

Conway and his house mates, Al Giray, Rachel Magel and Vince Pellett, are all staying with friends or relatives and none had any insurance.

Helen Thibodeau, her daughter Ashley, 10, and Bill Day lived on the other side of the semi. They were able to salvage some furniture and clothing, but their sofas, linens, towels, TV, VCR, appliances and other items need to be replaced.

"Normally I don't get

involved," Egerton said. "I think of my job as my way of helping. But knowing some of the people involved, meeting Helen (after the fire), I really felt I wanted to help out."

Egerton has set up an account at Canada Trust, called the Main St. Fire Victims Fund, which will accept deposits for the seven Georgetown people left homeless. The money will be divided equally among them.

She has also arranged for warehouse space for donated items to be delivered or for pick up. For more information, or to donate items call Egerton at 873-4797.

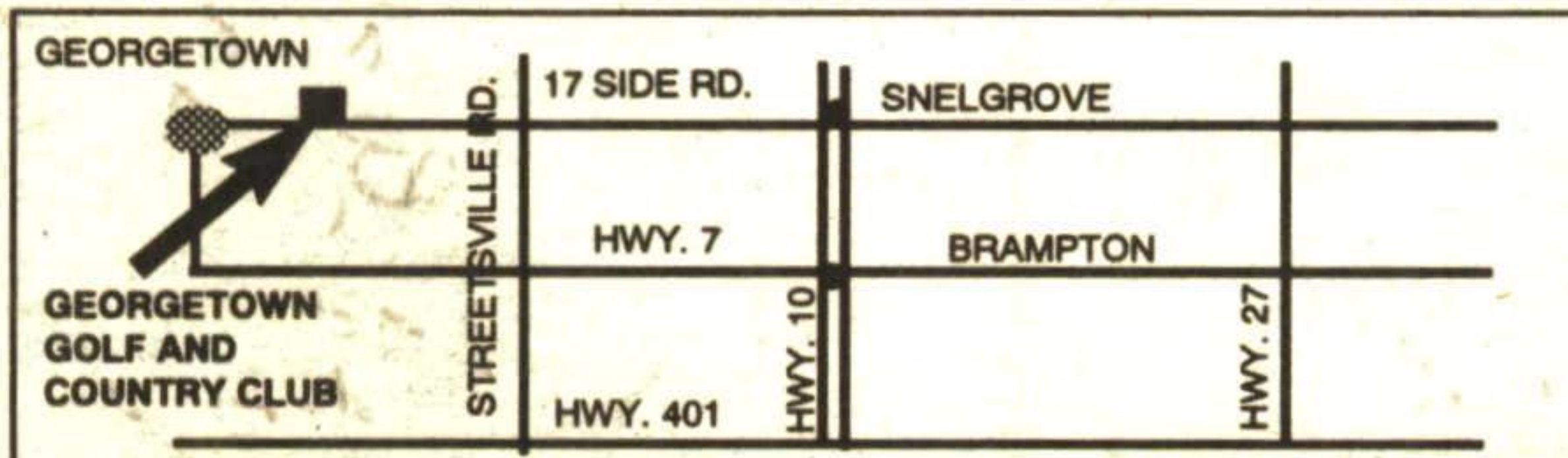
