

Fire guts Acton home

Only a few days after a Main St. N. Georgetown house was gutted by fire, the same happened to a rooming house at 10 Main St. S. in Acton.

The fire call came at 7:38 a.m. Wednesday. All five residents of several apartments in the building escaped the building uninjured, but one went to Georgetown Hospital, where he was examined and released.

Twenty-seven firefighters were on the scene until nearly 1 p.m. The fire was difficult to control due to high winds at the time. Damage to the building is estimated to be about \$100,000.

The fire appears to have started on a stove in a ground floor kitchen, but this couldn't be confirmed. The fire department is listing the cause as accidental.

While the owner of the building, who lives in Scarborough, had fire insurance, the residents did not. A vehicle may also have been damaged as a result of the fire, but the Halton Hills Fire Department are uncertain.

\$4,500 damage

Police are looking for the people responsible for smashing windows in two locomotives and a coach at the Georgetown GO Station sometime overnight Saturday, April 16. Pellet guns were likely used, resulting in \$4,500 damage.

Several charges

A 23-year-old Erin man was charged Wednesday with mischief, breach probation, failing to stop and dangerous operation of a motor vehicle. The charges come after someone reversed a 1981 Buick into a 1988 Ford pickup on Main St. in Acton after a dispute between the two drivers.


over \$5,000 Wednesday. The charge comes after a police investigation into damage to the Halton Hills Hydro building last month
