BUILDING A DECK

In our continuing effort to improve the quality of service provided to our residents, the Halton Hills Building Zoning & Enforcement Services Department will initiate a new pilot project on May 1, 1995.

TUESDAY IS "DECK DAY"
(May 1 - August 31)

Bring in your completed application for the construction of a private, residential deck, with all required supporting documents and drawings, and we will process your application at our counter on a first-come, first-served basis.

For residents of single family homes who plan to build a ground level deck, our zoning officers, plan examiners, administrative and support staff will be on hand from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon on every Tuesday during the summer to expedite the processing of deck permit applications. Subject to the volume of applications received, we anticipate service while you wait.

Contact the Building Department for a list of all required documents and design drawings (applications that are not complete cannot be processed under this program).

Halton police officers face variety of charges

Two police officers, one stationed in Burlington and a second stationed in Acton, face several charges and will appear before a Police Services Act Tribunal on May 2, according to a press release issued Friday.

In November the police were given information which indicated that two officers were independent distributors of Amway of Canada and were selling while on duty.

This began a four month internal investigation during which police officers and numerous citizens were interviewed. The investigation revealed multiple allegations of misconduct. No more information is being released by the police, because it is being used as evidence.

Not all of the allegations of misconduct are directly related to the officers involvement as Amway

distributors and Amway was not the subject of this investigation.

A nine-year veteran who is stationed in Acton faces the following charges: engaging in secondary activity without permission of the Chief of Police, discreditable conduct (six counts), insubordination, deceit, improper use of his position as a police officer and neglect of duty.

A seven-year force veteran, stationed in Burlington, faces the following charges: engaging in a secondary activity without permission of the Chief of Police, discreditable conduct (seven counts), deceit (five counts), improper use of his position as a police officer (five counts), neglect of duty (three counts) and insubordination (two counts).

Committee makes exception

Committee of council made an exception to the town's direct deposit policy for a former member of the committee of adjustment.

William Richmond requested he receive his final payment by cheque rather than through direct deposit. Richmond's previous payments had been by cheque and he attended his final committee of adjustment meeting on February 8. The new

direct deposit system was introduced on February 16.

The reasons for the exception spelled out in a staff report were that Richmond is no longer a committee member and won't be receiving any further payments and he is being reimbursed for services rendered prior to the date of the implementation of the direct deposit system.


