West Side claims Ontario volleyball crown

The West Side boys juvenile volleyball team are the best in Ontario, and Georgetown players and coaches helped earn them the provincial crown.

The local squad took the Ontario title in London earlier this month, with a 3-2 match victory over London's Forrest City in the championship finals.

The team won game one 15-10, lost game two 12-15, won game three 15-9, lost game four 13-15 and took the rubber match 15-11.

"It was really satisfying winning the provincial crown. We hadn't finished worse than third all season, but we told the guys that this was the only tournament that

really mattered," said Georgetown coach Andreas Schirm, who helped Bob McKay lead the senior GDHS Rebels to two consecutive Halton titles.

Along with fellow Georgetown coach Graham Sheppard, both first year coaches who each played for GDHS, Sean Peasgood and Brad Spears were part of the gold medal squad. Spears plays the weak side while veteran Peasgood is a power hitter.

"I would say their desire to play, and play well, is what makes these guys strong volleyball players. Sean is very vocal on the court and helps bring the team up when he's pumped for a match."

"While he's kind of quiet, Brad inspires the other players with his play, he's a digging machine," added Schirm.

The club beat Tri-City of Kitchener 15-10, 15-11 in the semi-finals and took down Ottawa 15-8, 8-15, 15-8 in the quarter-finals.


Peasgood won an award of excellence at the juvenile tournament while Spears won a similar honor at the junior tournament the week before in London.

The team will now advance to the National Championships in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island - being held May 11 to 14. The team finished fourth at the Nationals last season.


Athletes of the Week


