

Nassagaweya churches join forces to feed the world's hungry

A Canadian Food Grains project in Nassagaweya is well underway. This effort, sponsored by the Arkell, Eden Mills and Ebenezer United Churches and the Rockwood and Eden Mills Presbyterian Churches aims to alleviate hunger of people around the world.

The crop grown will be

donated to the Canadian Food Grains Bank, an organization that has connections in more than 25 developing countries. Two thirds of the food contribution is used for payment for work on projects to improve the food production in these countries. Funds raised will be matched 4 to 1 by the Canadian International Development

Agency.

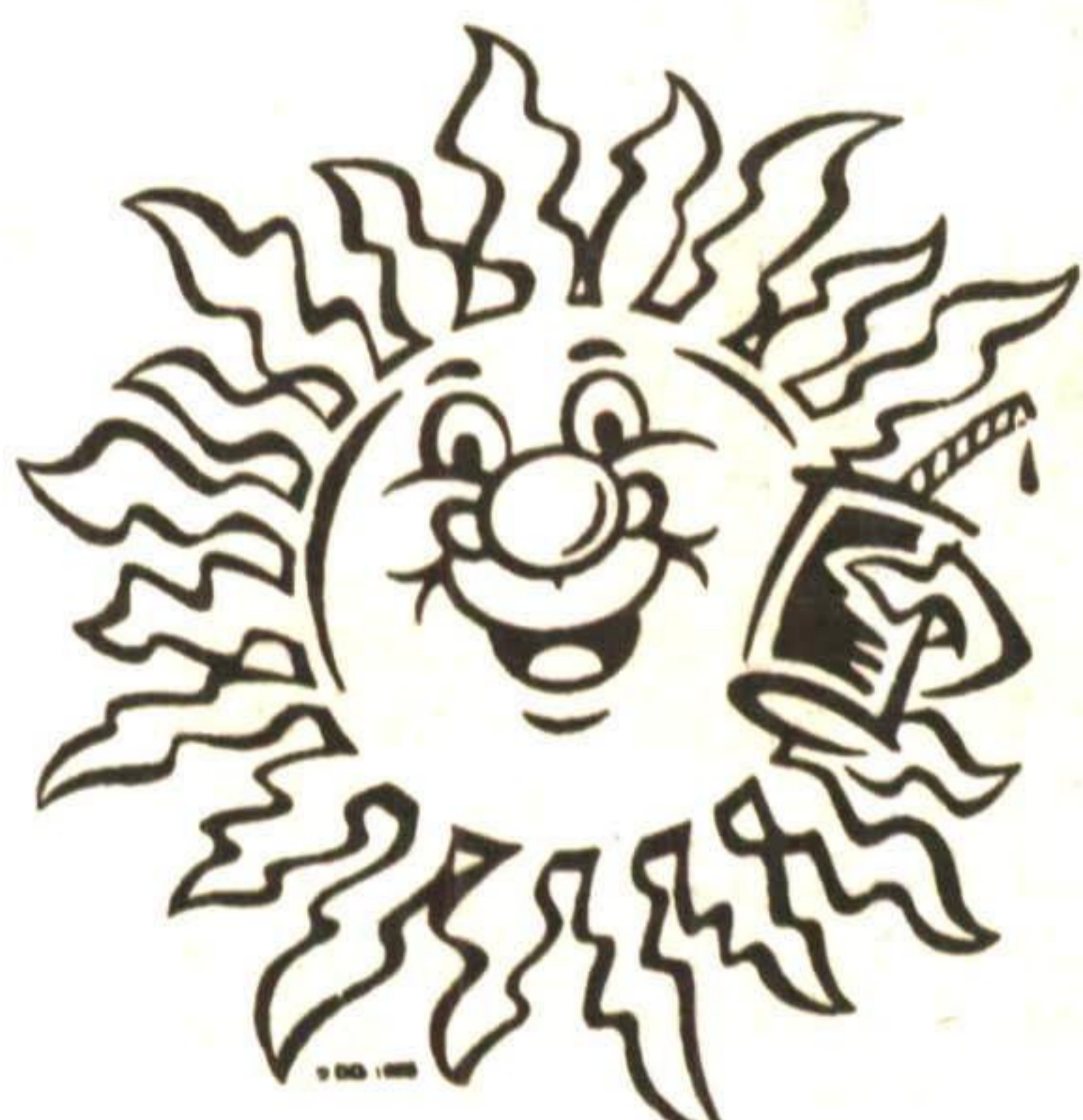
Twelve acres of soy beans were sowed on land donated by Alex McNabb on the Seventh Line of Eramosa. While the proposed budget of \$217 per acre to grow the soybeans might seem insurmountable, by breaking it down to an item by item cost, it can be done. Perhaps an individual or group

could donate money needed for a portion of the project — seed soybeans, \$19.50/bag, inoculant, \$16.50/bag, or 25 g of fertilizer, \$8. Donations of \$10 or more will receive a tax receipt and major donations will be noted at an on-site display board.

Several fundraising activities are planned. A Pancake Breakfast is scheduled for today

(May 28) 8-11 a.m. at the Eden Mills Community Centre. The price is \$3 for adults, \$1.50 for children. Tickets at the door. Information on the project and the Canadian Food Grains Bank will be on display.
