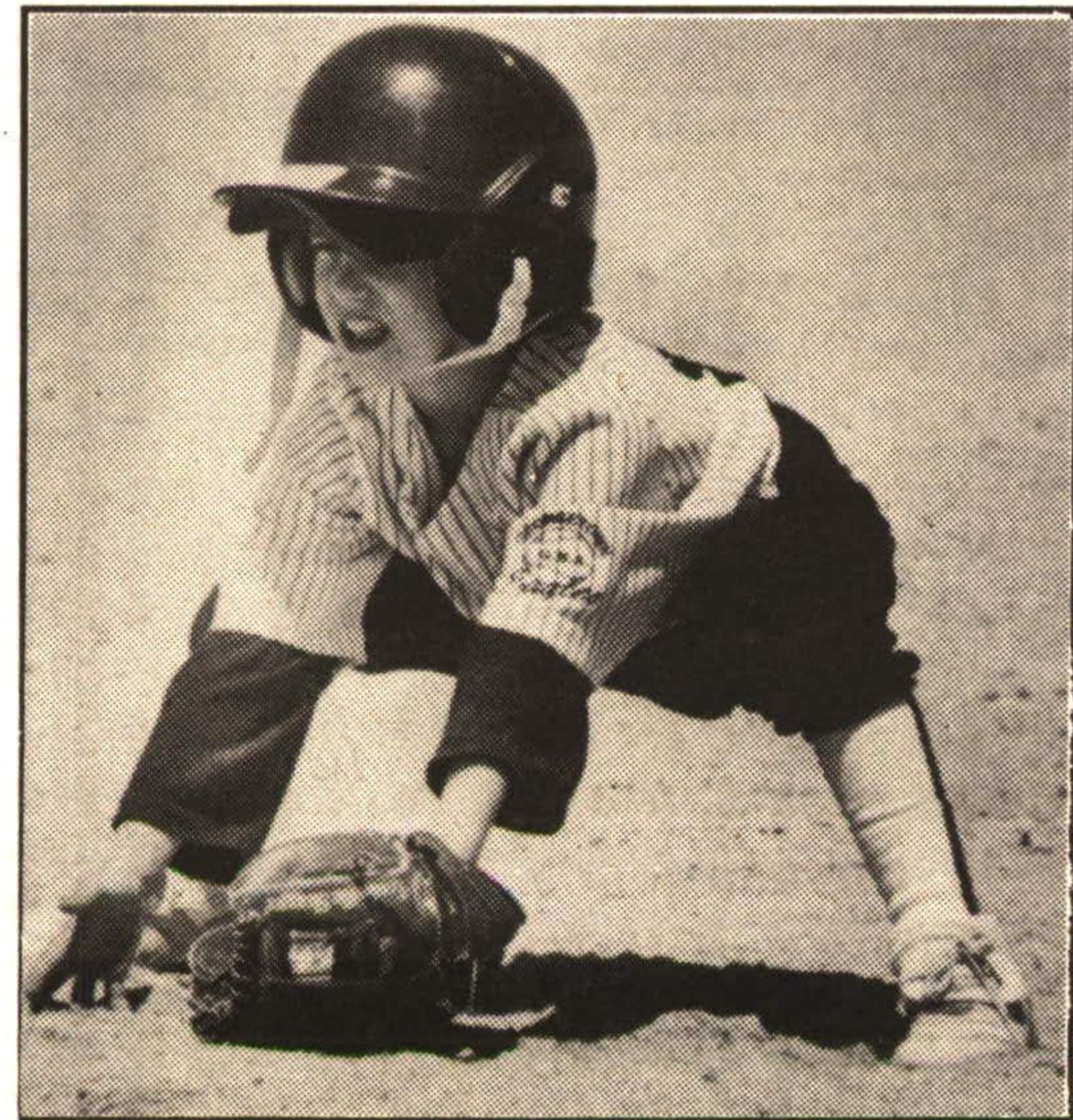
Centennial School's junior girls 4x400-metre team took sixth and its intermediate boys 4x400-metre squad placed fifth.

Beeney lost 6-7, 2-6 and Ouida Graville and Tammie Gill won 6-7, 6-3, 6-4.

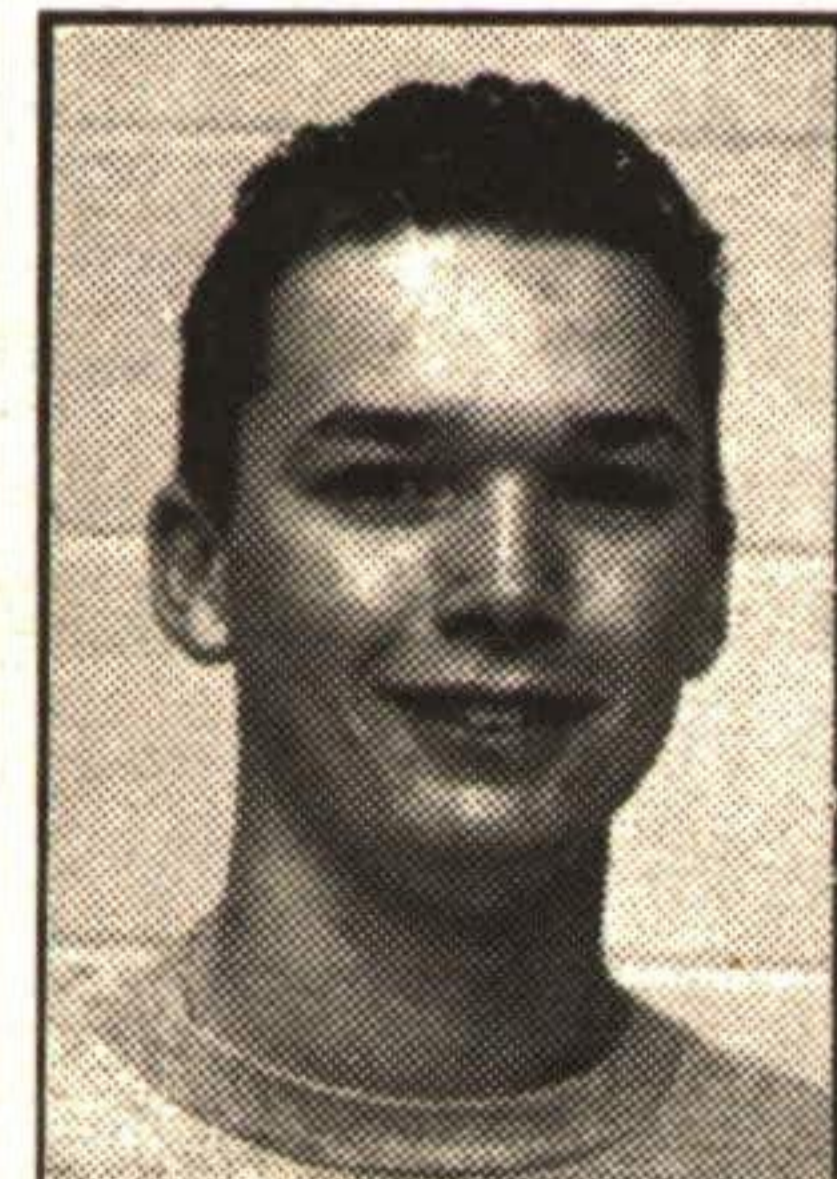
