### Tentative agreement reached

After more than a year of contract negotiations, the Halton Catholic School Board and its secondary teachers association reached a tentative three-year agreement, on Thursday.

Specific details of the agreement will not be released until the settlement is ratified by members of the Halton Secondary Unit of Ontario English Catholic Teachers, expected later this month. The settlement, however, does comply with the Social Contract, a contentious issue throughout the negotiations.

The teachers, who began a work-to-rule campaign this past winter, have been without a contract since September 1, 1993.

Halton Catholic School Board chair, Alice Anne LeMay said in a release that the agreement is fair for both teachers, students, and ratepayers.

# Acton man jailed for armed robberies

An Acton man was sentenced to three and a half years in penitentiary after pleading guilty to committing several armed robberies at convenience stores in Acton, Rockwood and Guelph.

Paul Logan, 36, was in Guelph Provincial Court May 31, said Halton Regional Police Service Det. Const. Kevin McCart, who attended the proceedings.

Logan, a Main St. Acton resident, pleaded guilty to 12 charges, including robbery of an Acton convenience store on Christmas Day, 1994, where he made off with \$300 to \$400 cash after threatening

the clerk with a knife, McCart said. He attempted unsuccessfully to rob another Acton variety store on Dec. 29, but the young female clerk managed to struggle free and Logan left without any money. Later that evening he robbed a Rockwood store.

On New Year's Eve, Logan returned to the same Acton convenience store he robbed on Christmas Eve and robbed it again, this time of \$550. He also robbed three Guelph stores in January, wearing a disguise in all of the robberies he committed.

Logan was described in court as a drug addict who would like to get into Stonehenge, a Guelph treatment

program for addicts, once he has been released from prison, McCart said.

"This definitely was a traumatic experience for every one of the (clerks)," McCart said.

Logan had been identified as a suspect and was under surveillance by a Halton police task force, which followed him into Guelph on January 18, when he began to commit a robbery at a Speedvale Ave. convenience store, McCart said. The Guelph police were contacted and they made the arrest.

A joint submission by the crown and Logan's lawyer recommended the three and a half year sentence, McCart said.

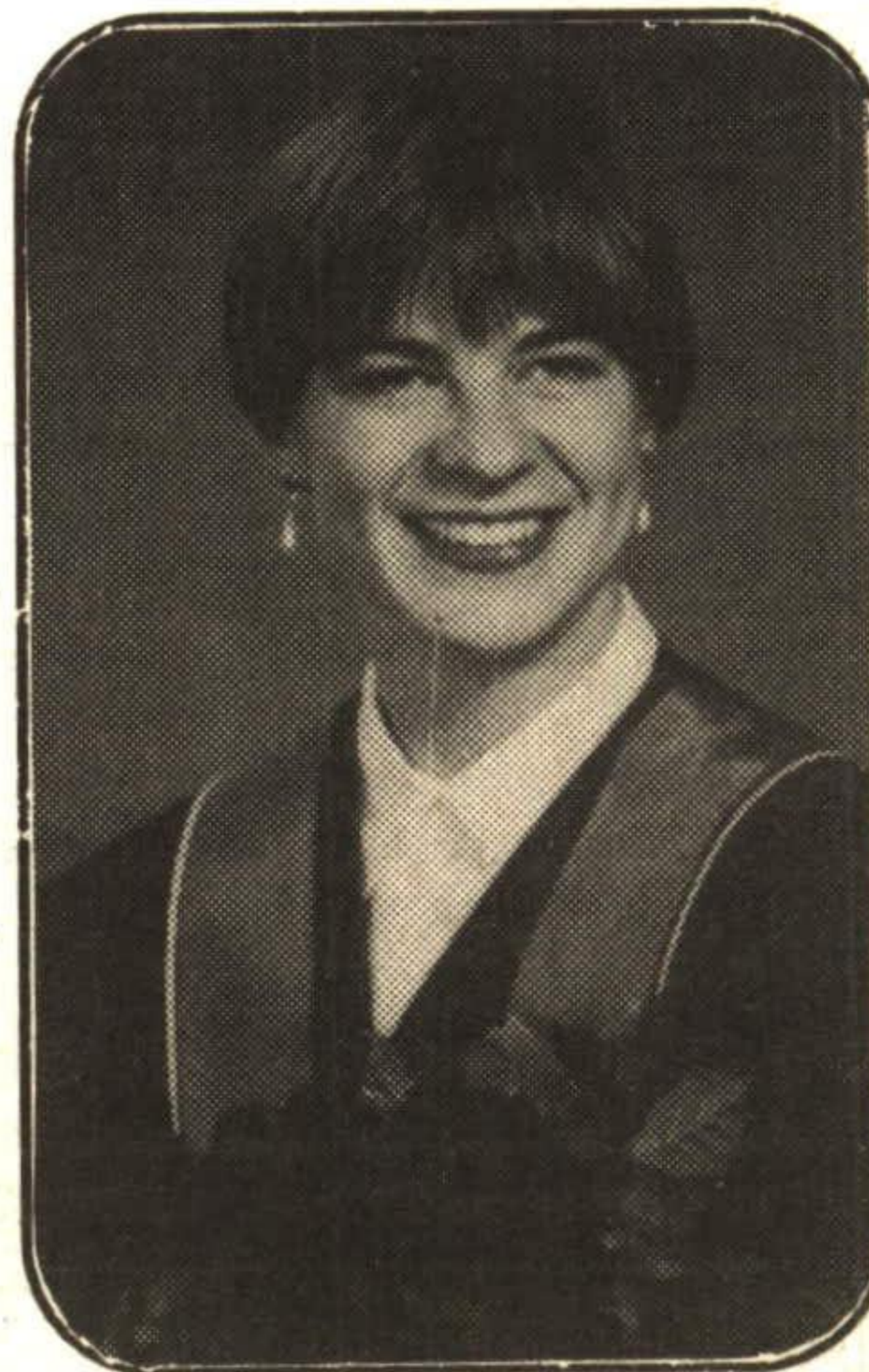
