Paul Campbell claims Murr tourney title

More than 250 golfers converged on Acton's Blue Springs Golf Club on Monday for the 11th annual Paul Murr Memorial Golf Tournament. Proceeds from the tourney go to the Acton branch of the Canadian Cancer Society.

In the 10 previous editions, the tournament, which was originally called the Acton Cancer Golf tournament, has raised more than \$145,000. This year's event raised another \$28,000. The name was changed in 1988 in the memory of Murr, a founding member of the tournament, who died of cancer.

"Paul was a well knowing member of the community and everyone on the organizing committee was a friend of his," says Jon Hurst, one of the tournament organizers.

With great golfing weather, this year's tournament was also a smashing success on the course.

The foursome of Ron Heller, Brian Sproston, Mike Usatis and John Anderson captured the scramble title. Second went to the team of Darryl Betts, Dave Betts, Ron Kuiken and Matt Spehar, third to Tim Coles, Dugald Dick, Gord McArthur and Hugh Forbes.

Stuart Sketchley stroked his way to the low net crown. Andy Blow finished second and Jim Cater third.

The low gross winner was Paul Campbell. Doug Bishop took second and Ted Ellis third.

There were a number of other awards given out. They were: IGA closest to the pin award to Bill Burkart; Air Canada closest to the pin award to Bob Little; Guelph Mazda longest drive award to Marg Hoare; and the Halton Hills Furniture putting contest to Dave Betts.

No one was able to walk away with one of the three hole-in-one prizes. They were sponsored by Park Lincoln Mercury, Don Coffey/Peter Homer Seadoo and Acton Travel/Sunquest. Blue Springs also sponsored an "on the green" contest.

Rebels compete at Ontario finals

It was Kingston or bust for five Georgetown District High School track and field athletes last weekend.

The Rebel quintet travelled to Queen's University to take part in the Ontario high school track and field championships (OFSAA).

While they weren't able to bring home any medals, coach Bevin Clarke was extremely proud of his charges, especially considering the high level of competition.

"Overall, the field gets better and better every year," said Clarke. "Some of the athletes are world class."

The best Georgetown example of this "world class" competition was in the junior girls triple jump. Helen Raynard pulled off a leap of 10.05 metres which was good enough for 10th. At the regionals a week earlier, Raynard earned a fourth with a jump of just four centimetres more.

The Rebels' top performance was turned in by Ryan Howatt. Howatt finished seventh in the junior boys high jump, clearing 1.9 metres.

Matt Brain, who is headed to the United States in the fall on a track scholarship, ended his high school athletic career with a ninth place showing in the senior boys javelin. Brain's best heave was measured at 48.73 metres.

In the senior boys discus, Kevin Taylor finished 10th with a distance of 39.76 metres.

Amanda Bonnell, a double medallist at last year's championships, was 12th in the junior girls 400-metres, clocking a time of 60.73 seconds.

Grand slam for Zander

Limehouse M and M Pro Sports midget girls were treated to an unfriendly welcome in Inglewood last week.

Last Thursday against Mississauga Croatia, the CSC squad scored two late tallies for a 5-2 win. Joel Petkoff fired both Acton goals.

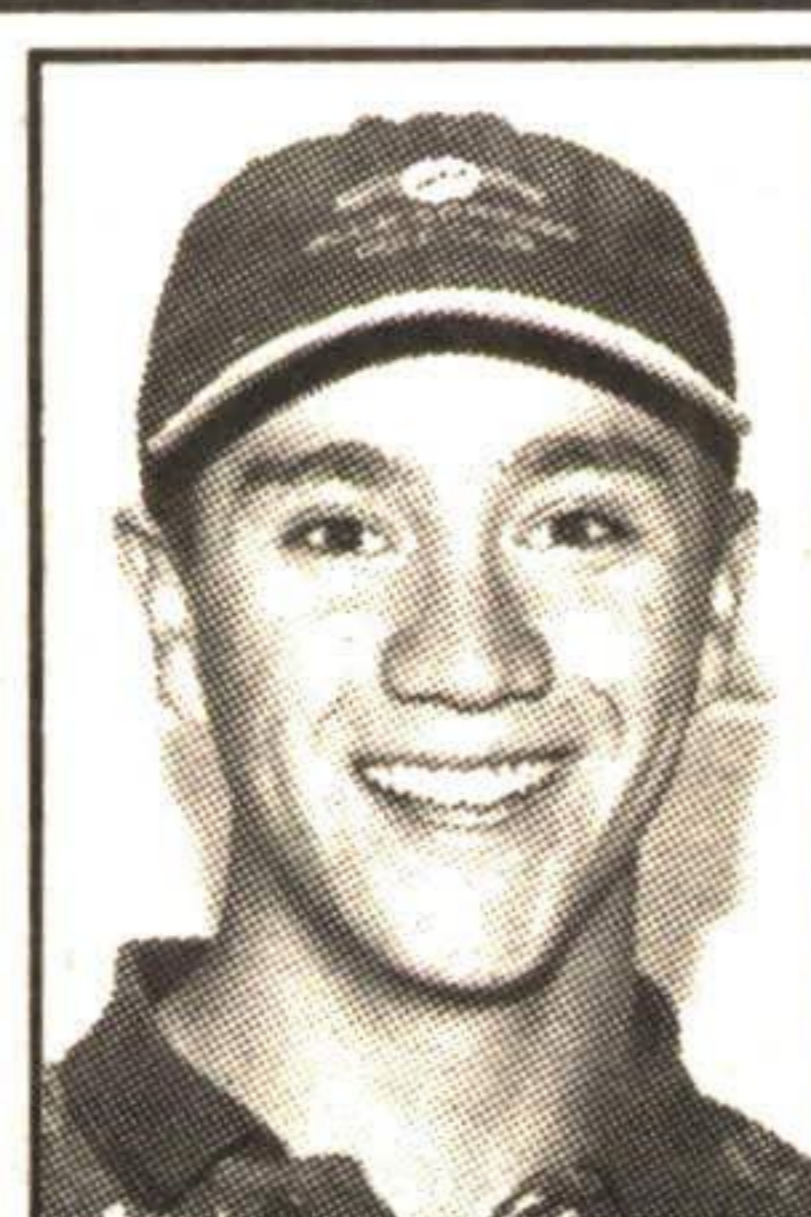
