## French friers fuming over notices

Councillors grappled with the question of whether french fry trucks are vehicles or restaurants at recent committee meeting.

French Fry truck owners Claude Morissette and Bill Cox were at the meeting to discuss notices of violations they had received from the town's bylaw enforcement officer.

Cox said the infractions against him were ridiculous and added "I

thought the town was supposed to help small businesses, not harass them."

Morissette said he was fed up with the harassment from the town.

In a report to committee, bylaw enforcement officer Bob Ustrzycki said the town received a complaint about the construction of enclosures around the two refreshment vehicles.

Ustrzycki said in the report while issuing the notices of violation staff saw the trucks, one at 32 Guelph St., and the other at 9989 Trafalgar Rd.,

had been altered to the extent the "design, intent and use had changed from a vehicle to a poorly architectured structure."

According to Ustrzycki the trucks have expired licence validation tags, the trucks are jacked up, both operators could not produce valid certificates of mechanical fitness and vehicle insurance.

The report also said the owners of the vehicles have built raised decks and enclosures without obtaining building permits.

Bylaw enforcement said both operators were using propane tanks no longer attached to their trucks, the vehicle on Trafalgar Rd. is violating the town's sign bylaw, and seating has been provided at both locations.

"The combination of all these factors has changed the design, intent and use of what was once a CORNED BEEF refreshment vehicle," Ustrzycki's report.

In the end committee supported a recommendation directing staff continue to enforce the notices of violation against the two, but did not support an amendment to the town bylaw prohibiting modifications to refreshment vehicles without the town's permission. Councillors urged the two truck owners to sit down and discuss the violations with staff.




