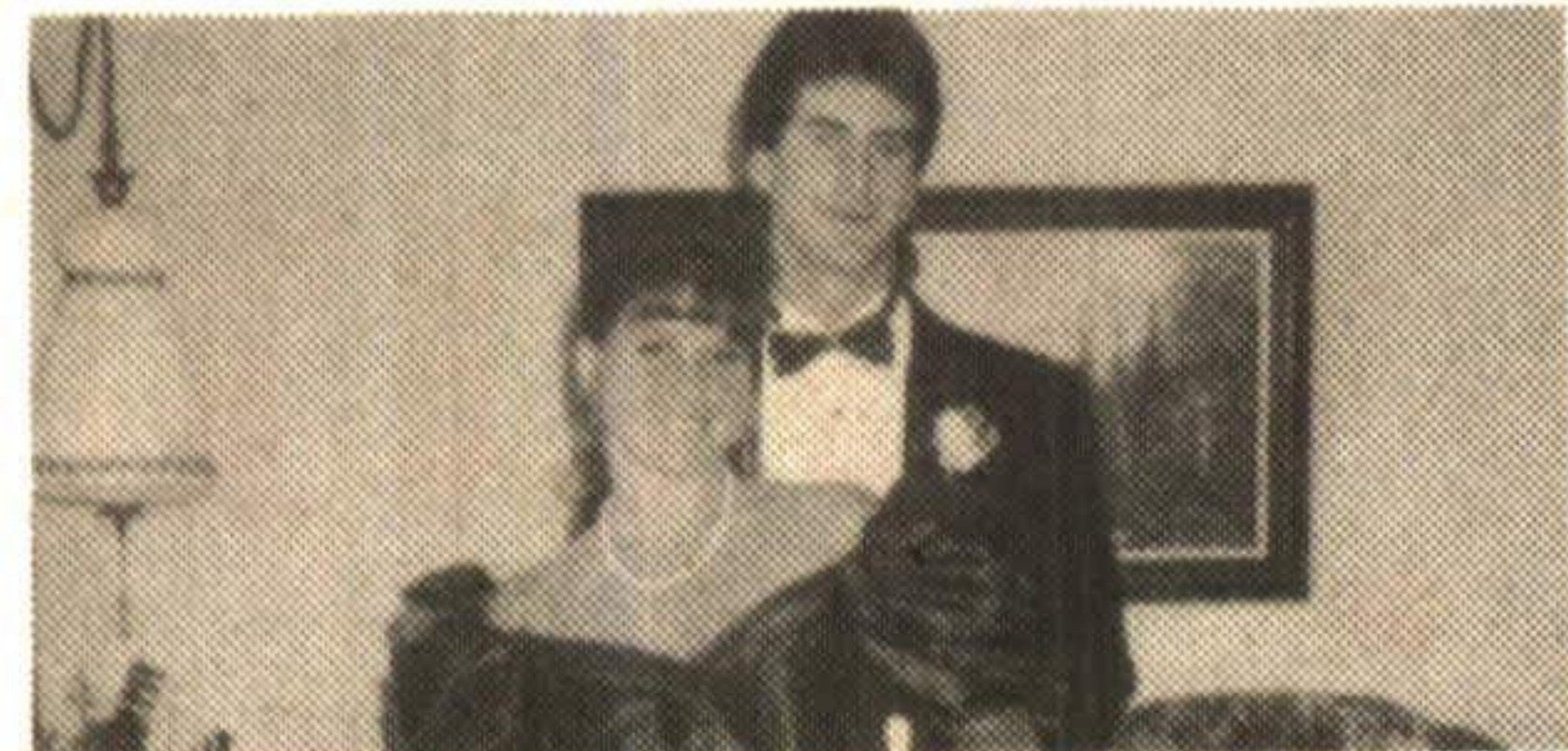

There are lots of similarities between sports and theatre in the mind of

Craig Logue, a man who hopes to start a non-profit summer theatre in Georgetown next year. Logue is artistic director for Centre of Attention, a

North York theatre. He graduated from Ryerson two years ago after studying drama. An information meeting on the summer theatre for Georgetown will take place Tuesday at 7 p.m.

Logue also works as a goal judge at Maple Leaf Gardens during hockey games, and plans to keep this job.

"I like sports and the arts. They're both entertainment. A really good hockey game can be as good as a play. There's a sense of drama, but you never know how it's going to end," said the 25-year-old Scarborough resident.

He hopes to find a job locally and move to Georgetown as soon as he can so that he can begin to set up a board of directors for the summer theatre. He expects to work as the artistic director, a volunteer position until the theatre becomes established.

His aunt Jackie Blight, a Georgetown resident saw one of Logue's plays with a group from Georgetown Alliance Church recently. The group enjoyed it, and suggested that Logue might want to do the same thing at John Elliott Theatre in

Georgetown.

"Toronto is a difficult market to tackle. There's a lot of theatre in Toronto and people want to go downtown to see plays, not go to North York. It's hard to get funding and hard to compete with plays like Showboat," he said.

He thinks he would do much better in Georgetown, which has 4.5 million people living within an hour and a half. He hopes to produce plays for a three-week run, with a cast of two to four people. The season would run from Victoria Day to Labor Day, and feature Canadian-plays, possibly in repertory.

He would use both professional and local actors. Logue said he has been to the theatre and Chamber of Commerce, and both are supportive of the idea.

He is looking for volunteers to serve on the board of directors, and perform tasks like fundraising, marketing, accounting and general volunteers.

Logue hopes anyone interested in the summer theatre will attend the Tuesday night meeting. Call Jackie Blight at 873-6699 for more information.

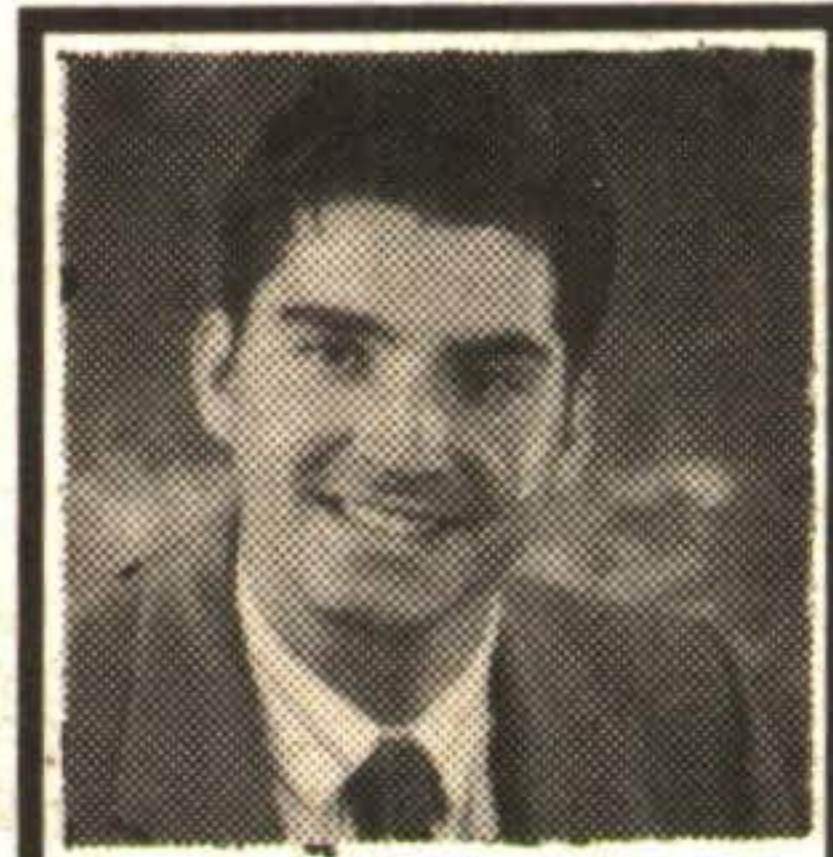
