New three-year deal

Teachers ratify new collective agreement

At a June 20 special meeting of the Halton Roman Catholic School Board, a new three-year collective agreement with its secondary school teachers was ratified.

This contract, which covers the period from September 1, 1993 to August 31, 1996, complies with the province's Social Contract.

The secondary teachers voted to ratify this collective agreement in a supervised vote conducted by the **Education Relations Commission on** June 16.

As a result of this contract, two experience increments will be restored on September 1, 1996 to the secondary Catholic teachers in Halton, which was accomplished by a number of adjustments to their collective agreement.

The Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR) in Halton Catholic secondary school has been increased from 16.5 pupils to 17.75 pupils on September 1, 1995.

This concession results in net savings to the board of 10.5 teachers, above the staffing targets of the Social Contract.

The department heads and the assistant department heads will now have one more instructional period, which will result in the establishment of 63 more classes in the secondary period.

Adjustments to class sizes were made to the OAC (Ontario Academic Credit), advanced level courses and destreamed Grade 9 classes.

Other adjustments were also made to the health benefits section of the secondary teachers collective agreement.

The ratification of this contract by both parties results in the full and immediate withdrawal of the "work-to-rule" sanctions which were imposed by the secondary teachers on February 21.





The first instalment of the 1995 Final Taxes is due:

TUESDAY, JUNE 27TH, 1995 - REALTY AND BUSINESS

Taxes may be paid at the Finance Department (1 Halton Hills Drive, Georgetown), Halton Hills Hydro Office (43 Alice Street, Acton). After hours, by cheque, at the Town Civic Centre Night Depository located at the main entrance or any branch of the Canadian Imperial Bank located within the Town of Halton Hills subject to a service charge. Cheques post-dated and received by the due date are also acceptable and will ensure that instalment dates are not missed. Tax payments beyond the due dates must be paid at the Finance Department.

A Penalty of 1.25 per cent per month will be charged on the first day of each calendar month until taxes are paid.

Failure to receive a Tax bill does not excuse the property owner or business operator from responsibility for payment, nor relieve him/her from liability of penalty for late payment.

Payment by Telephone
