## Heart and Stroke Foundation looking for plenty of bikers

The Halton Hills Heart and Stroke chapter will be bringing the 30-seater Big Bike to Acton and Georgetown on Saturday, July 29.

The Big Bike Ride for Stroke is a special event to raise funds for research into stroke. Stroke is the major cause of adult neurological disability in Canada and kills 14,000 Canadians each year, according to a release from the Halton Hills chapter.

The local chapter is estimating they will raise over \$7,000 from this one-day event. The Heart and Stroke Foundation of Ontario funds two-thirds of all heart and stroke research in Ontario it is supported by individual donations, with government funding.

The Big Bike Ride for Stroke is a 30-seater bicycle is ridden by community teams made up of 29 riders who have collected a minimum of \$50 in pledges from family, friends, coworkers, businesses and neighbors. The Heart and Stroke Foundation will provide the driver. Each ride team will ride for approximately 30 minutes and cover a pre-determined course of 3 to 5 kilometres in Acton and Georgetown.





## CARING FOR DENTURES

- 1. Remove dentures every night. Brush your teeth, tongue and gums carefully with a soft tooth brush. Be sure to clean and massage your gums. If your toothbrush causes irritation, try moistened gauze.
- 2. Soak dentures overnight in luke warm water or denture cleanser. This loosens plaque so you can brush it off more easily. If your dentures have metal clasps, use water only.

See your denturist regularly. Your mouth changes constantly so dentures will need adjusting from time to time to ensure the best

If you are in hospital, it is recommended that you have your name inserted in your dentures, in case of mix-ups. Name inserts can be done while you wait, at a very minimal cost.
