

Town has alternative parking plan

After concerns were voiced by Charles St. residents over the town's plans to replace the minor ball diamond at Georgetown Fairgrounds with a paved parking lot, town staff has come up with an alternate plan.

The plan, which would see the ball diamond remain and the parking area situated next to the old armory backing onto the treeline, would have to be approved by council before it could go ahead.

Tom Shepard, the town's director of Recreation and Parks, said this plan, which is a modified version of one previously considered by staff, would actually create additional green-space.

The parking area would be paved and marked, resulting in about 64 spaces.

He said the new plan would be a "win-win situation for everyone."

The current plan, already approved by council, includes the elimination of the minor ball diamond so a paved parking area can be installed. Landscaping is also to be done and storm sewers installed. Shepard said it was the preferred plan because it allows for parking expansion in the future and there are too many ball diamonds at the fairgrounds now.

Charles St. resident Peter Wilson, whose property backs onto the

diamond, is not impressed with that plan, which he said he wasn't notified about.

Wilson explained having a parking lot behind his home will depreciate the value of his property and he is concerned for the safety of his son who may walk out of their backyard onto a parking lot. He is also concerned about headlights shining into the back of his house.

Shepard said there are no requirements for the town to notify area landowners — that only applies

to planning issues. He added the town placed a courtesy public notice in this newspaper on Wednesday, May 10 inviting the public to attend an information session focusing on the planned improvements for the fairgrounds.

The improvements, slated to be done in the fall, are to be funded by the Canada/Ontario Infrastructure Works Program. The town, provincial and federal governments are to kick in one-third each of the approximately \$100,000 budget.

Some rural roads slated for name changes

As Halton Region moves toward the Enhanced 911 system that displays name and address of each caller in an emergency, duplications of road names within the region must be corrected. Hopefully, a name by any other name will be less confusing for emergency services.

Changes will affect three roads by August 17, to meet Bell Telephone deadlines. Because of deadlines, residents immediately affected will be notified by direct mail. Milton town staff recommendations approved by council recently are as follows:

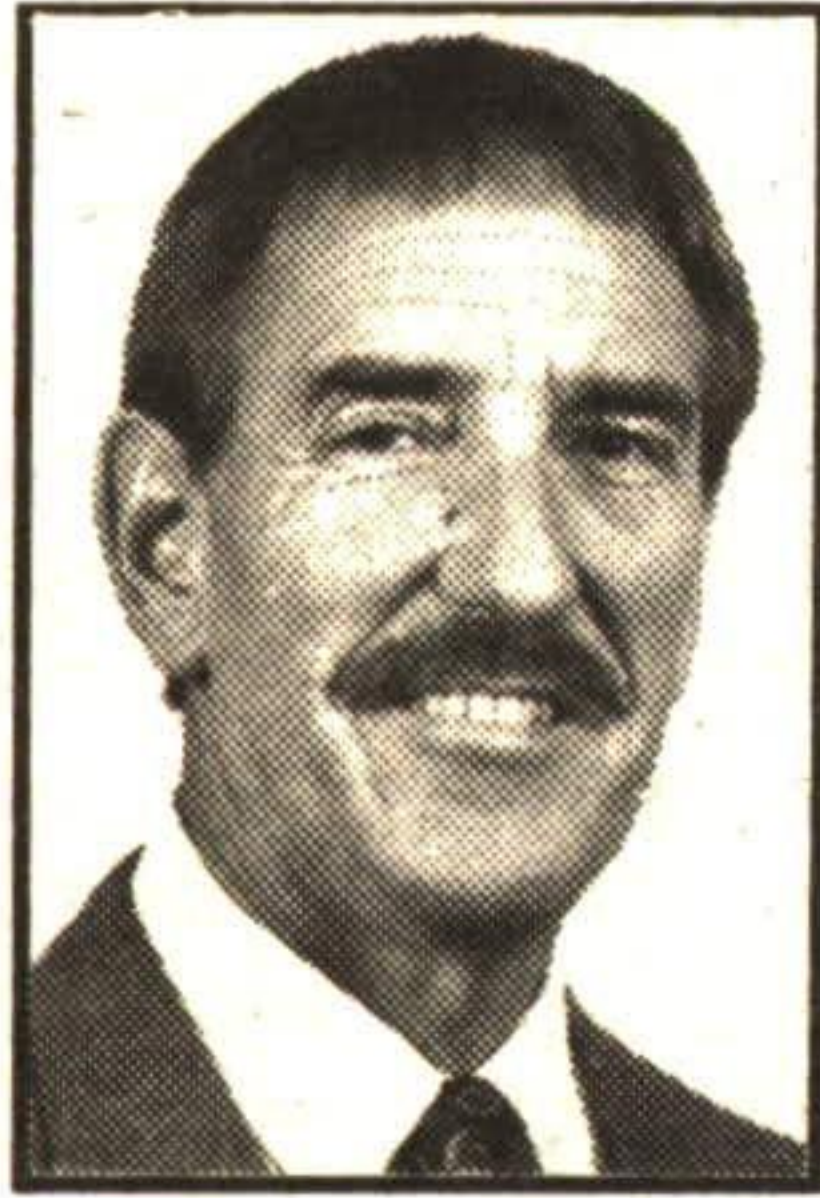
First Line Nassagaweya and Esquesing: First Line Esquesing between Steeles Avenue and Hwy. 401 will become Peru Road. First Line Esquesing, north of Hwy. 401 will become Dublin Line to match up with Dublin Line, Halton Hills. First Line Nassagaweya remains

the same.

Campbellville Road, as a regional road, is subject to changes by the Region. Halton Region staff will review Milton's recommendations and report to regional council who ultimately will decide. The Milton planning department recommends that Campbellville Road, east of the Nassagaweya/Esquesing town line to the Halton Hills boundary remain Campbellville Road, while the road west to the Guelph Line be known as Campbellville Road West.

In a second stage, further changes will be required as all of Halton Region moves to the Enhanced 911 system.

Duplications, and in some cases triplication, of road names exist for the First Line, Fourth Line, Fifth Line, Sixth Line and Townline of Nassagaweya, Esquesing and Oakville.
