Red Cross sets high goals for Monday's blood donor clinic

The Red Cross hopes that 250 to 300 units of blood will be donated at the blood donor clinic at Holy Cross Parish Hall on Monday.

"We're so grateful to donors and Georgetown donors have been very faithful and generous in attending (the clinics)," said Barbara Vivash, clinic co-ordinator for the area. She said the clinics are a co-operative effort and about 50 volunteers help out by performing a variety of tasks like putting up posters, calling people to invite them to attend and donating refreshments.

Vivash points out that six out of every 10 Canadians will require blood or blood products in their lifetime and about 800 donations of units of blood are needed each weekday to keep up with the demand at the 61 area hospitals.

Yet only 14 out of every 100 people in central Ontario eligible to give blood actually do so, she said. Summer is always a difficult time to get people to attend the clinics.


"Many people are on holidays. We've got companies which have shut down, and a lot of donations come from companies," Vivash said. "Holiday weekends increase the number of accidents and the need skyrockets."

Only half a litre, or about one tenth of your body's supply, is taken during a donation. And Vivash points out you can't get any disease by giving blood.

Monday's clinic, sponsored by the Georgetown Independent and Arthur F. Johnson and Associates Real Estate will be held at Holy Cross Church, 224 Maple Ave., between 1:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.

People between 17 and 70, who are healthy and have proof of identity are usually able to

donate.
