Business as usual

No changes for ASSIC

It's business as usual for Acton Support Services and Information Centre (ASSIC) since the Conservative Progressive government did away with plans to create new multi-service agencies (MSAs) across the province.

"It shouldn't affect us in any way. We're similar to an MSA on a local level," said Lorne Doberthien of ASSIC. The new agencies were to provide "one stop shopping" and replace or incorporate a multitude of organizations, including large ones like the Red Cross and VON and small ones like ASSIC. The new MSAs were to improve access to services, but many people felt that volunteers would be lost as a result of the change.

There was not yet an MSA for Halton region, and agreement on how it would be organized was a contentious issue. Halton Hills wanted its own organization, but the District Health Council decided to have one MSA for the region with four area offices.

"We would have had to live with whatever came down the pike, if

they had decided on a regional organization. We're happy with what we've got," Doberthien said.

But Georgetown doesn't have an organization equivalent to ASSIC, and the new MSA could have improved access to services in that community.

The Harris government gave itself 60 days, until mid-September, to meet with people in the long-term care system and get their ideas on how to coordinate services.

A Halton Hills group called the Local Service Delivery Area Committee (it used to be called the Halton Hills MSA committee) has been meeting since last fall, trying to ensure that service improves for Halton Hills residents.

"We don't know what (the new organization) is going to be. We know we need improved and more accessible services in the north," said Rosslyn Dowell, a committee member and gerontologist. "I was disappointed (to hear the new government's plans). It's been on the books since the mid-70s. This means they decided to consult yet again, and every time the government changes, it seems to mean more delay."


