Regulations will be enforced

The regulations require owners to retrofit buildings with more than two apartment units. While the regulations came into effect Oct. 9, 1992, landlords were given two years to compete the work to bring their buildings up to minimum standards. Landlords were also able to ask for an extension of up to two years if they needed this time to comply with the regulations.

Maveal said most owners in Halton Hills haven't asked for an extension, which worries him that they may not be carrying out the

upgrades.

Regulations apply to numerous items including fire separations between residential occupancy units, access to exits and having appropriate fire alarm equipment in working order. Inspectors from the Halton Hills Fire Department carry out inspections on buildings to point

out deficiencies.


The buildings which come under the regulation are apartment buildings or mixed commercial residential buildings with more than two units.

Anyone who hasn't complied with this legislation or has not received an extension is in direct violation of the retrofit legislation and may be subject to prosecution. Upon conviction, an owner is liable to penalties of up to \$25,000 for each charge (\$50,000 if the owner is a corporation) or one year in prison, or both.

Maveal said he and other inspectors are helping many property owners work towards making their buildings fire-safe and are ready to assist anyone else. Call 877-1133 if you need help or have any question. Tenants who have concerns are also welcome to get in touch with the fire department.








RECIPE OF THE MONTH BEAN MUSHROOM MEDLEY

8 ounces fresh green beans, cut into 1-inch pieces (about 1-1/2 cups)

1-inch pieces (about 1-1/2 cups)

2 fresh medium carrots, cut crosswise
into halves, then into 3/8-inch strips

8 ounches fresh mushrooms, cut into 1/4-inch slices (about 3 cups)
1/4 cup margarine or butter

1 teaspoon salt

into halves, then into 3/8-inch strips 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt 1 medium onion, cut into 1/4-inch slices 1/8 teaspoon white pepper

Heat 1 inch water to boiling in 2-quart saucepan. Add beans and carrots. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer, stirring occasionally, until almost tender, about 12 minutes; drain. Cook and stir onion and mushrooms in margarine in 10-inch skillet over medium heat until almost tender, about 5 minutes; reduce heat. Cover and cook 3 minutes.

Stir in beans, carrots, salt, garlic salt and white pepper. Cover and cook over medium heat 5 minutes.

Top with sesame seeds or crushed almonds.


