Your July 30th editorial suggested that Mike Harris was too quick at the trigger to cancel the new Acton Co-op housing project planned. You also stated that there was "an acute lack of affordable rental housing in Acton."

If the editor had taken the time to read their own Want-Ad section, they would have discovered a number of affordable rental properties listed therein in Acton and Georgetown.

There is no shortage!

As to a perceived economic benefit, the building of the Cobble Hill Co-op did little to improve the local economy since the tender for construction was not awarded locally. And the cost per unit was at least a third higher than local for-profit private developments at the time. Again, check your own real estate ads of the day.

If there truly is a need for more low-income housing in Acton, then make space by evicting the higher income tenants at Cobble

Hill. These people are said to be paying "market value" rent already so they can well afford to move to the private market, yet they currently are occupying what are allegedly needed units.

In fact, there would be many more rental apartments available, save for the NDP (and Liberal) government's diddling with the housing market. I know of several local landlords who were forced out from the local housing rental market due to the construction of the Cobble Hill Co-op. In my own case, I have left space empty rather than compete with my own tax dollars.

How about the fifth estate cutting Mike Harris some slack. A politician who fulfills their election promises with due speed should be a refreshing change.

In case you hadn't noticed, there is going to be a lot of work ahead to repair the oppressive damage left behind from Hurricane Rae and his ragtag band of Communists.

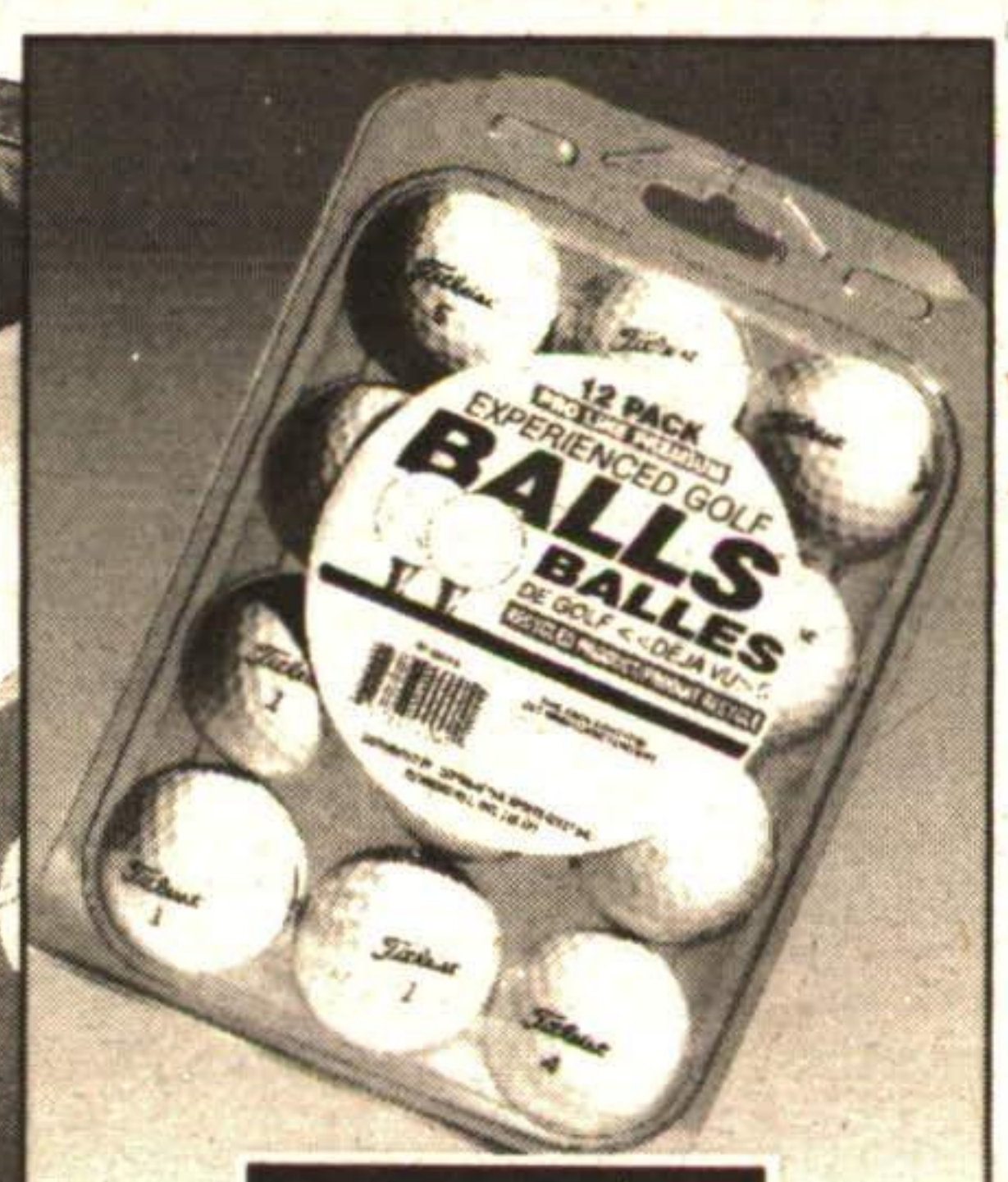

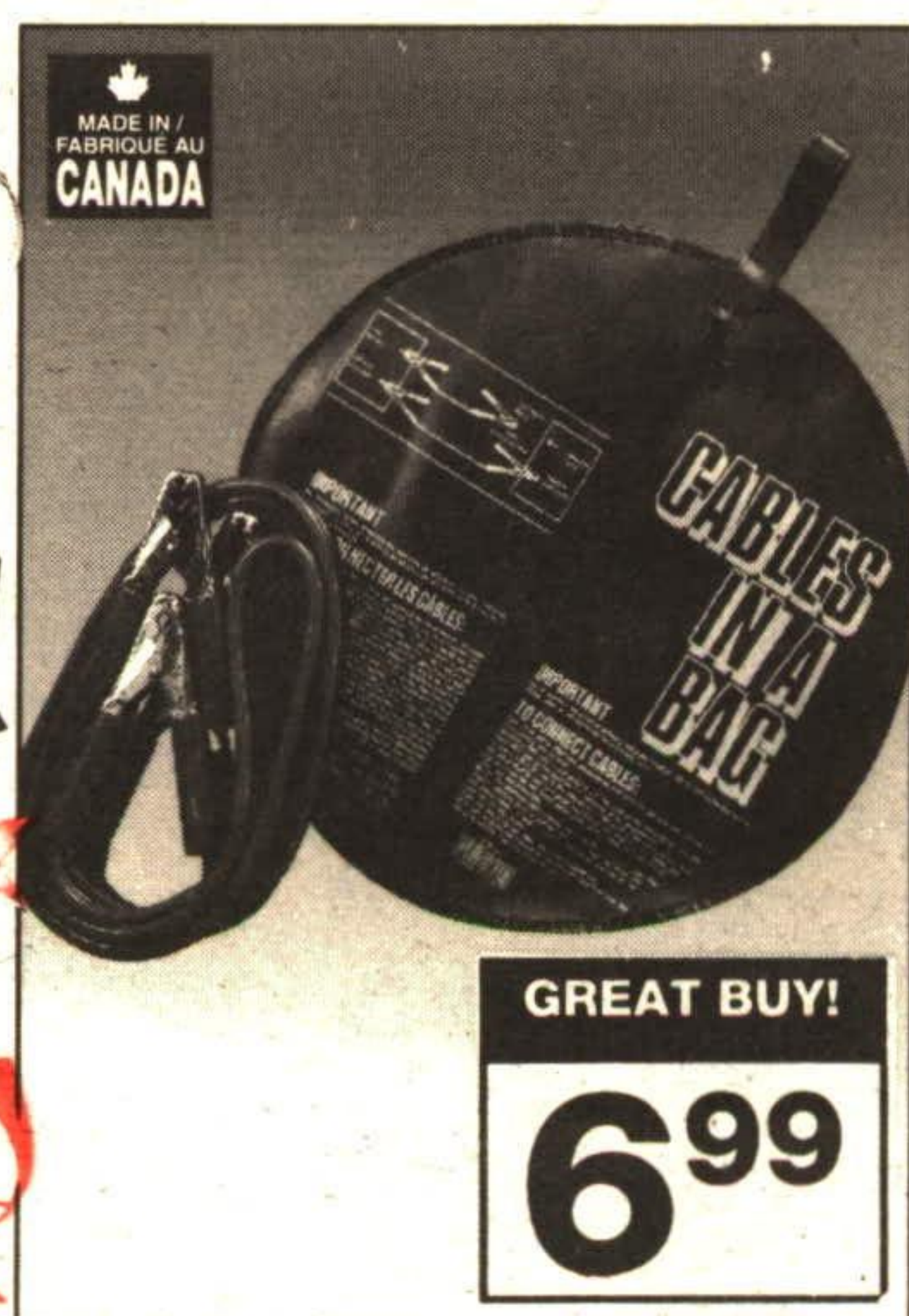
