## Former Eagles have hopes of landing senior squad-

If a group of former Georgetown minor baseball players have it their way, Georgetown will be home to a new baseball team next spring.

The group initially came together in early August to discuss the possibility of forming a senior-level team which would compete in an existing league with 12 teams across southern Ontario.

"We're trying to create an enjoyable level of baseball," says Mike Ross.

"We find that we really miss the game, and it's hard going out of town to play on a team where you don't know anyone," adds Kevin Hughes.

Both Ross and Hughes are members of a committee that is attempting to get a Georgetown franchise off the ground.

They've received permission from the Town of Halton Hills to use the Fairgrounds on Sundays at 4 p.m. for practices. Now, they're looking for players and sponsors.

"We want everything done before we go into the spring, so that nothing jumps up at us at the last second," says Ross. "Our main goal is to try and get as

many people as possible committed to play. We're hoping to have as many players as possible chosen before the end of the year."

He says that it will cost approximately \$9,000 to field a team. That includes the cost for diamond rentals, equipment, league registration and uniforms.

Individual players will be responsible for raising money for uniforms and registrations. The proposed team would also have major sponsors who would pick

up the tab for equipment and other

According to Hughes, the Central Ontario Baseball Association has indicated that the chances of Georgetown landing a team are "95 per cent" if the financial obligations can be met.

Anyone interested in trying out for the team, which will have at least 20 players and two or three coaches, can attend the practice sessions at the Fairgrounds. There is a \$50 fee for trying out.

Rookie rearguard hopeful Mike Monaco gave Georgetown the tie with just 1:02 remaining in the third when he scored during a goal-mouth scramble.


Assisting on the goal was veteran forward Bill Rennie, who scored Georgetown's first and third goals in the opening half of the game.
