

# Fire damages rural home

A pan of grease left unattended on the stove resulted in a \$45,000 fire on Sixth Line Wednesday night.

The Halton Hills Fire Department was called to the scene at 10:08 p.m. and 26 firefighters responded. They were on the scene until 12:25 p.m.

A fire department official said there are three apartments in the residence.

One of the residents left the grease unattended for a few minutes and when she returned, the fire had started. She attempted to put it out herself, then went upstairs and got another tenant, who

tried to extinguish the flames. They tried unsuccessfully and called the fire department.

There was heavy smoke and fire damage to one unit, while the other two had light damage.

Two of the tenants had no insurance, while the third did have insurance.
