Videotape leads to arrest of suspect in Wal-Mart theft

A former Wal-Mart assistant manager, Kenneth Robinson, 40, was arrested and charged with theft over \$5,000, at a Toronto hotel Saturday night.

A warrant had been out for the arrest of Robinson since an incident at the Georgetown store on the July 16 weekend.

Employees returned to work that Monday to find an undisclosed amount of cash missing from a safe. Police won't say how much money was taken, only that it was over \$5,000. Robinson didn't show up for work that morning.

Halton Regional Police Det. Sgt. Ron Welsh said that a woman employed by the Mississauga Wal-Mart was at Pearson Airport at 6:30 p.m. waiting for friends to arrive.

She and her husband saw him and immediately began recording him on the camcorder they brought to record the arrival of their friends. They got the licence of the airport limousine which

picked the man up. The woman contacted Wal-Mart and the Halton Regional Police became involved. They determined that someone had been dropped off at a Bloor St. Hotel in Toronto.

The man was arrested by two officers at 8 p.m. and held for a bail hearing.


