### CUTWORMS: ARE THEY IN MY LAWN?

This year I have found infestations of cutworms in several places throughout Halton Hills, especially in sodded lawns 2-5 yrs. old. The worms, which are the larvae of the moths that fly around your lawn have been damaging lawns for the past 2 weeks. If you have noticed gold-ens/brown patches forming in your lawn over the past couple of weeks have a look to see if there are tiny holes approximately 1/4" in diameter in the grass. If you find this condition, then you may have a cutworm infestation.

Adult cutworms (or moths) appear in the late spring to lay their eggs. The larvae will emerge in July/August to begin damaging your lawn. Some larvae over winter in your lawn, resurfacing the following spring. The larvae emerge and begin feeding as early as May with the damage appearing in May/June.

Cutworms are large, greyish, green and brown larvae which viciously chew on grass plants. They live on the soil surface or in the thatch layer, during the day they burrow into vertical holes to hide. When nightfall arrives, they emerge from their burrowed hole and feed at the rim of the hole, stems, leaves and roots of grass plants may be injured leaving yellowish/brown dead patches, with a hollow hole in the middle of the circle. The damage looks quite similar to symptoms of dryness. Other symptoms to watch for include birds, starlings have a keen ability to locate cutworm larvae. When these birds return frequently to an area, cutworm larvae may be present.
